The Oregon Supreme Court ruled this week that A. W. Lafferty, Portland, a candidate for congress, be allowed to have a picture of Sacajawea and a map of Western Oregon in the Voters' Pamphlet.

Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry, whose duty it is to produce the pamphlet informed Lafferty that he would follow precedent and accept for publication only statements of candidates and their late bust photographs. Lafferty took his rejection slip to the courts. He may have established a new format for the pamphlet.

Chief Justice Earl Latourette who wrote the majority opinion said, "The respondent's theory that the secretary of state had discretion to determine the appropriateness of submitted material if followed would not provide for any mode of appeal and could not be controlled by mandamus. Under this theory the secretary of state would be in a position to exercise a tremendous political power not contemplated by the lawmakers."

In concurring, Justice George Rossman said, "One picture is worth 1,000 words. What a censoring official might deem irrelevant may in fact be a winning argument with the voters."

Justice Lusk in his dissent observed that under the majority opinion any statement however foreign to the purpose or outlandish, any picture whether it be of Sacajawea or Mickey Mouse would have to be accepted because it might seem pertinent and germane to the candidate although not to the secretary of state.

The gate is down for cartoonists, gag writers and flattering portrait painters who can help elderly candidates evade that part of the corrupt practices act which demands that photographs over three years old cannot be used in election promotion work.

R. R. RATE CUT UPHELD The Public Utility commission has no authority to prescribe minimum or maximum rates for railroads. Justice Rossman, who wrote the opinion said, the philosophy of the regulating acts has not been to eliminate competition and that rates may be varied downward to meet competitive conditions. . . the prohibition in the statute is to pre-

vent attempts by a railroad to discourage any particular class of freight by too high rates or inadequate service.

The case was the Southern Pacific company against the Public Utility Commissioner and Pacific Island Tariff Bureau, representing 400 truckers.

CITY ZONING SUSTAINED The Court also upheld an ordinance of the Salem city council that had been held invalid in a Circuit Court. The Supreme Court's ruling validates the municipalities regulation of zoning.

The opinion was written by Justice Warner, who said, "The law accords a presumption of validity to zoning ordinances." He found the evidence given regarding alleged detriment to community welfare to be "too vague, speculative and inconclusive to overcome presumption."
