CANDIDATES' FILING FEES
Filing fees paid by candidates, along with cost of space for statements and portraits in the Primary Election Voters' Pamphlet, aggregated \$11,290. David O'Hara, registrar of elections for the Secretary of State, said Monday. The filing fees totaled \$5,810 and pamphlet space \$5,480. O'Hara said printing of the pamphlets is nearing completion for the last counties, and all will be delivered before May 3. The law provides that copies of the pamphlet shall be mailed to all registered voters in the state.

PLANS FOR STATE FAIR
The biggest little word in showbusiness, "new", will be on the E pennant of the 1954 Oregon State Fair Commission. Plans are in high tempo for a redesigned, record breaking show. The commission met this week to confer with the Salem Chamber of Commerce and the Salem Planning Commission, developed previously, accepted arrangements and reelected Dr. E. B. Stewart of Roseburg, chairman, and Henry Aherns, Turner, secretary.

The 1954 eight-day fair will open Sept. 4. The signal program change will be nationally known circus to supplant a rodeo. Besides decorating streets the Salem C of C will operate tourist booths for fair visitors with a general information service and book lodgings with local motels and apartment houses.

STATE FIGURES
Taxes collected from employers during the past year aggregate \$11,241,184 lowest since 1946 while an additional \$1,705,955 was received from the federal government as interest on the state's reserves.

Oregon teenagers had 17,063 work permits issued for their employment during 1953. Ninety per cent of the permits were for part-time work.

The state unemployment compensation trust fund dropped \$9,149,246 in the past year and may go slightly lower.

The poorest parole and proba-

tion risks are persons convicted of crimes of violence. Murder, assault with intent to kill, sex offenses and nonsupport are at the bottom of the list with violation rates of 15.8, 15.4, 14.8, and 12.5 respectively.

\$456,000 KITCHEN

EMPLOYMENT LAW FORUM
A state forum on intergroup relations sponsored by the State Bureau of Labor will be held in the Lincoln High School auditorium, Portland, May 8. Oregon is one of a small group of less than one-fourth of the states having fair employment practice laws. This state is making progress in developing an understanding and acceptance of the brotherhood theory in employment relations.

The forum, the fourth of its kind since enactment of Oregon's Fair Employment Practices act, proposes to call together labor, management, school, religion and community representatives for promoting Democratic principles in intergroup relations and for further development of the educational program against discrimination as stated by State Labor Commissioner William Kinsey said Friday.
