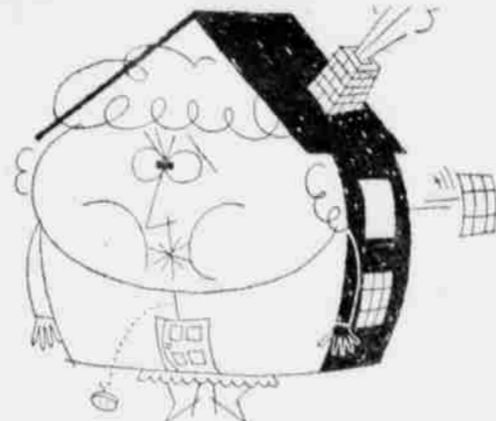
Special observances will be given at the Nazarene and Community churches on Mothers Day May 9 in the morning.

ciety will be started Tuesday evening at 7:30. This is for children from 12 years old and up. Any one of this age is welcome.

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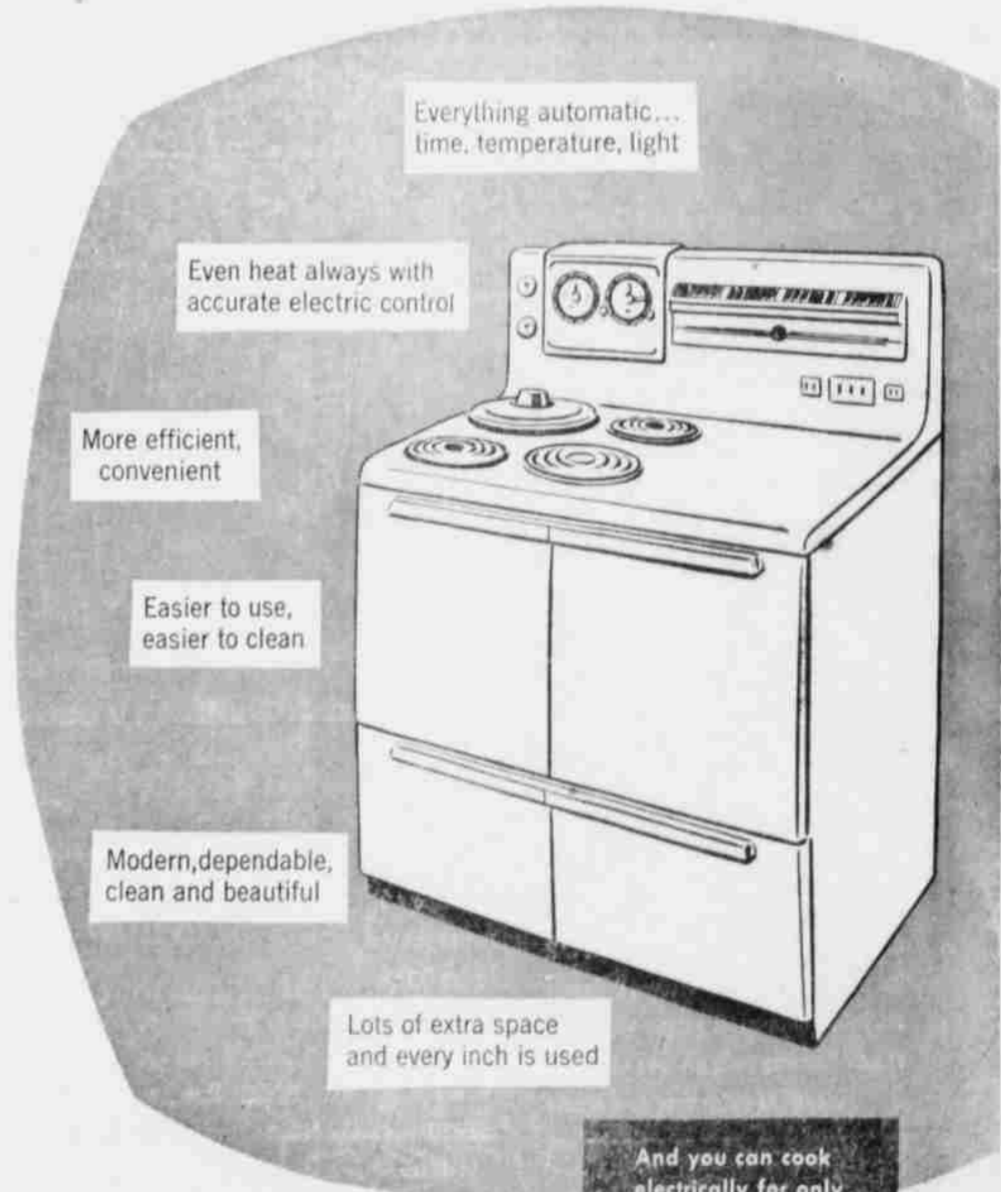
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
