lowing program: recitations by

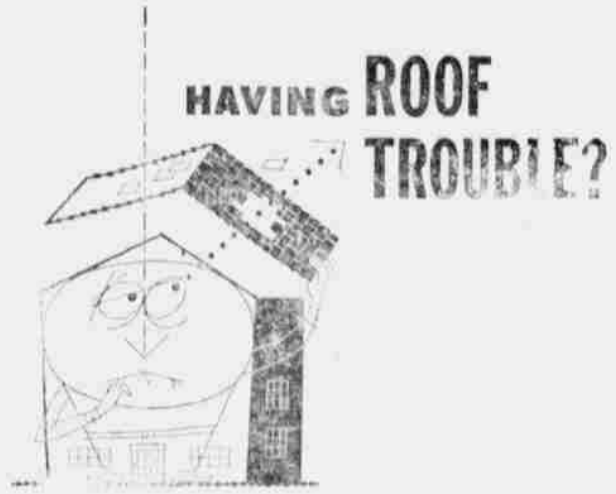
