House of Representatives were successful in winning nominations to the Senate Friday. Their combined legislative service totals 60 years. More than one half of the members of the present House have been nominated to succeed themselves. The 34 have a combined legislative service of 208 years. Among them is Dean of the House, the venerable Rep. Harvey Wells of Multnomah who has served in the House 28 years. Another group of eight, members of sessions previous to 1953 were nominated. Their combined service totals 42 years. If the voters reckon that only experience counts they could have a legislature with a combined legislative adventures totaling nearly a half century.

NON-FARM JOBS INCREASE There was an average of 446,500 persons working on non-farm jobs during the past month, which is almost one thousand more than the previous 30 day period and only three per cent below the same time last year. The all-time high mark last year was 495,300. The decline in employment compared with a year ago is caused by fewer jobs in the lumber and construction industries, the unemployment compensation commission said Monday. The commission reported 75,000 lumber and logging workers last month compared with 83,500 the same time a year before.
