If farmers do not approve wheat quotas, price supports will drop to 50% of parity for farmers who stay within wheat acreage allotments. If quotas are approved, farmers who violate allotments will pay a fine equal to 50% of the loan rate on excess bushels and will also be ineligible for price supports. In order to explain the provisions of wheat

acreage allotments, wheat diverted acres, and other pertinent information, a meeting will be held in Morrow County on July 15. It will begin at 8:20 p. m. Representatives from Oregon State College, A S C committee, and the Oregon Wheat Growers League will participate in this educational program. Further particulars will be announced by newspaper.
