



**INTERMEDIATE INSTITUTION**  
The State Board of Control has not always had as much good luck in buying advice from famous consultants as in the present case of its employment of Dr. Sanford Bates to assist in planning and administering the new intermediate institution for young criminals.

Here is some of his wisdom: Age should not be an exclusive factor in sentencing to the institution. Some persons of 18 years are older in criminal ways than others 50 years.

Keep the distinction in the public mind that the institution is not primarily for punishment but is built around the concept that the men who go there still have a fair chance of being reclaimed. Set up a diagnostic center to determine to which institution an individual should be sent or a joint classification procedure to confirm or amend the judge's decision after he has indicated to which institution they should go.

A sentence limitation, probably of five years.

The top official should be called the superintendent rather than warden.

He advised that the location of the new \$1,250,000 institution should not be near the penitentiary or the Woodburn School for Boys but in the southern part of Marion county near Jefferson.

**WOULD ALTER GOVERNMENT**

State Treasurer Sig Unander has advised the "Department of Revenue" legislative committee that he favors transfer of jurisdiction of the State Tax Commission to the state treasurer's office. Also he advocated establishment of a cabinet form of government in Oregon.

The "Department of Revenue" has tentatively recommended transfer of the gift and inheritance department from the state treasurer's office to the Tax Commission.

The State Treasurer also proposed the establishment of a single division under the Secretary of State's office to collect all licenses.

**REARRANGE TAX WORK**

In the recently announced reorganization of the state tax commission the income groups have been assembled as the Income Division under Commissioner Ray Smith who will not ad-

minister the Income Tax, the Amusement Device Tax and the Timber Severance Tax.

The Property Tax will be administered in toto by Commissioner Samuel B. Stewart, chairman of the board and current president of the Western Association of Tax Administrators. He also is in charge of the Valuation Division, formerly the Utility and Assessment and Taxation Division.

The administrative services division, under commissioner Carl Chambers, will handle all functions applicable to the commission as a whole, such as legal matters, research, personnel and payrolls.

**GRANGERS EXPRESS VIEWS**

1. Urging Congress to appropriate immediately planning funds for Green Peter dam on the South Santiam river so that construction can begin by July 1955.
2. Increase the minimum butterfat content of milk.

5. Oppose partnership that would turn power or generating facilities over to private controls.

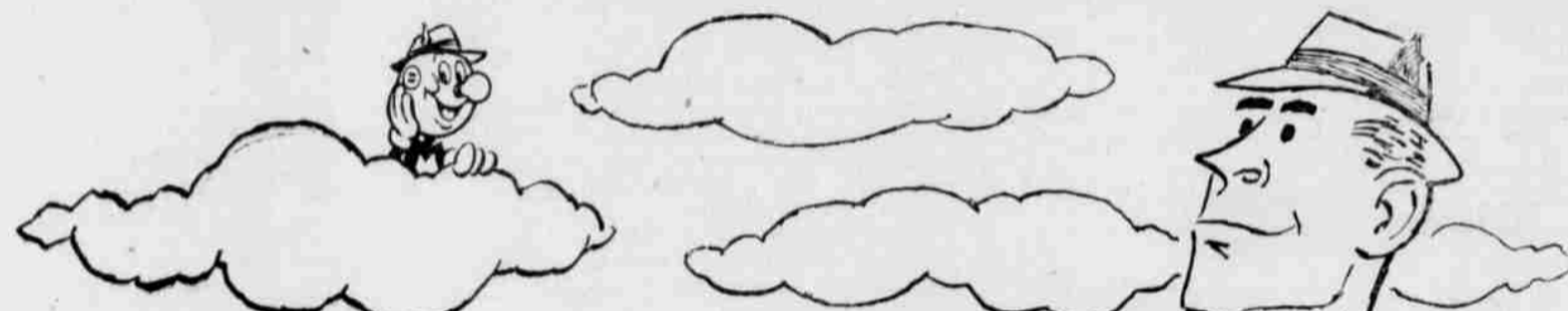

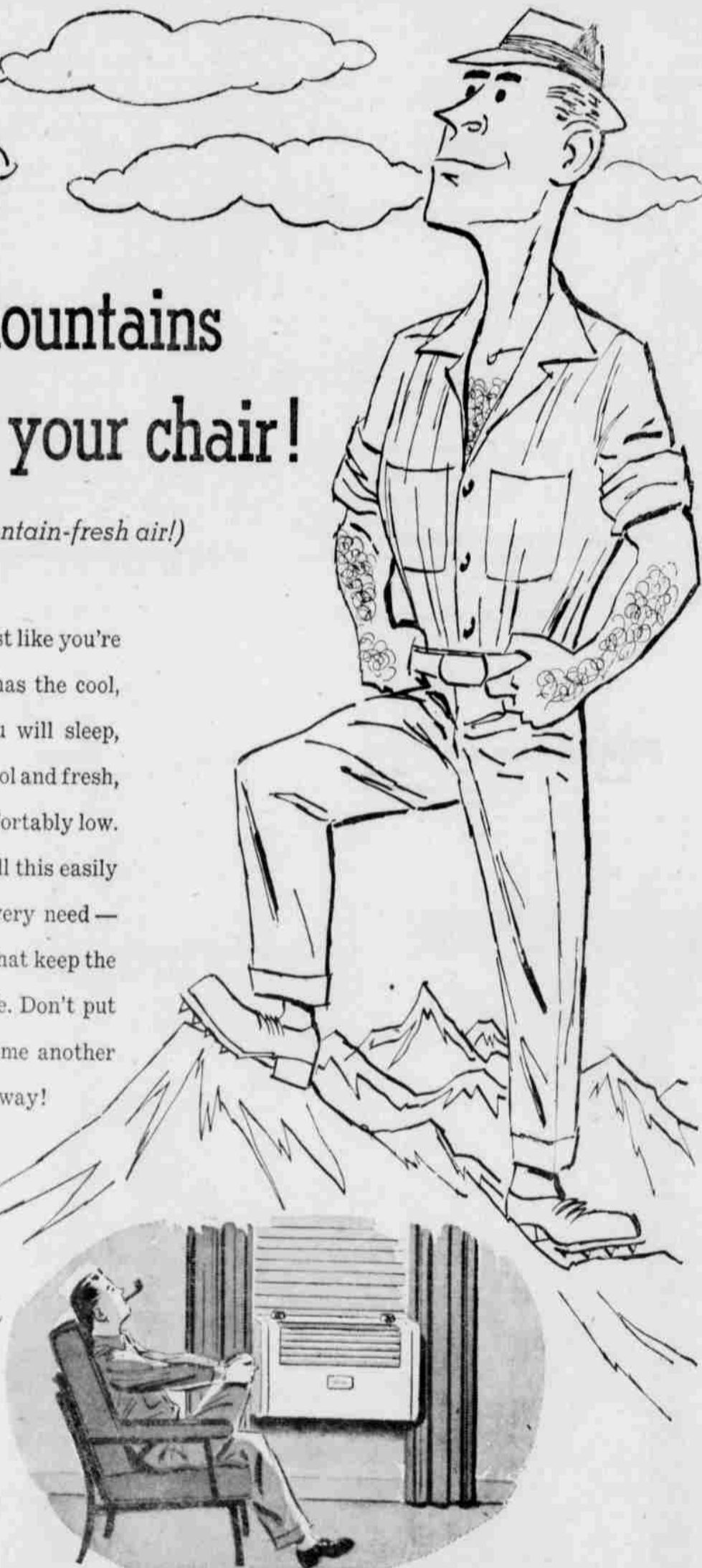
