COURT PROCEEDINGS (Continued from Page 2) stock guard across a county road on Upper Rhea Creek with requirements that it be constructed in accordance with county specifications.

A petition bearing the signatures of 406 residents of Morrow County requesting the Court to keep Paterson Ferry in operation, the Court agreed to submit an option which would enable them to investigate and possible purchase.

The Court accepted the bid as the lowest and best bid offered of the McCormack Construction Company of Pendleton of \$100,792.00 for the construction of an addition to Pioneer Memorial Hospital. This bid was approved by the Public Health Service.

The Court did provide and appropriate the sum of \$7,920.00 for use in and about agricultural or farm demonstration and field work in Morrow County, during the Fiscal Year July 1, 1954 and ending June 30, 1955.

The Court allowed the following Bangs Disease Claims: John J. Glavey, \$40.00; Harold L. Rash, \$16.00; W. Howard Cleveland, \$19.88; and John J. Glavey, \$24.00.
