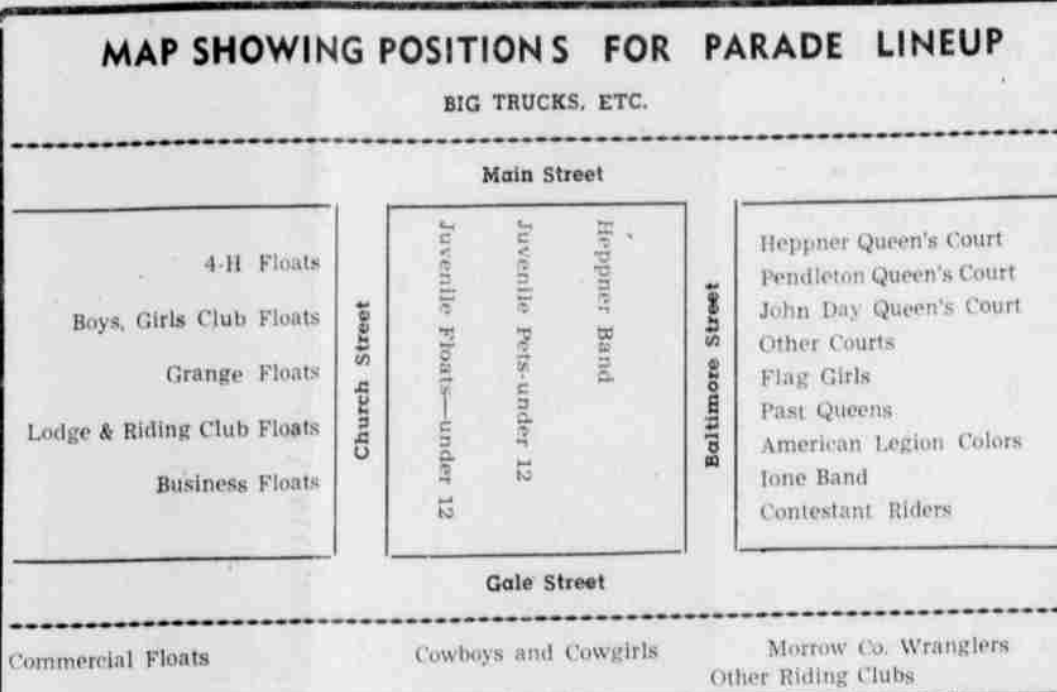

### 1700 4-H Youths Entered at State Fair

Four-H club exhibits at the Oregon State fair will fill every bit of the allotted space, according to Burton S. Hutton, state 4-H club leader. First exhibits will be arriving at the fairgrounds in Salem Friday, September 3.

"About 1700 youngsters will be taking part in the 4-H exhibits at the fair," Hutton said. "From all indications, there is keener interest in project activities this year than in a long time," he noted.

Split show on livestock—with 4-H the first half of the fair and FFA the last half—could mean more livestock exhibits, he said. The state leader anticipates an increase especially in dairy animals.

Departure of 4-H livestock exhibitors Tuesday will make more living space in the 4-H dormitory available to others the last half of the week, he said. Fair dates are September 4 to 11. Only rabbits of the 4-H animals will be shown the last half of the week. All others, including poultry, will be released Tuesday evening.

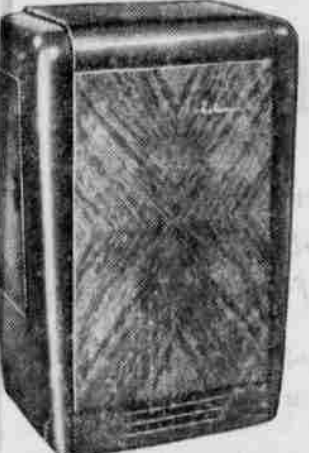

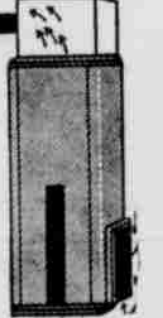
