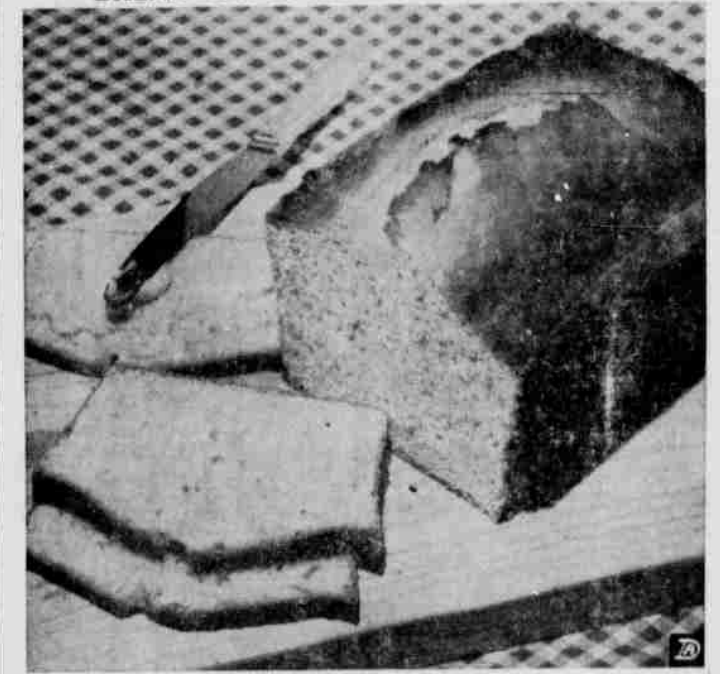

TOASTED COCONUT LOAF (Quick Bread)

Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients. Sift together into a large mixing bowl—
3 cups sifted Sperry Drifted Snow "Home-Perfected" Enriched Flour
1 cup sugar
3 teaspoons double-action baking powder
1½ teaspoons salt
Add—
1½ cups toasted* coconut (4 oz. can)
1½ cups milk
1 large egg, unbeaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
Stir vigorously until ingredients are blended. Turn batter into a greased and floured large bread loaf pan, 9½ x 5½ x 3 inches. Bake in a preheated moderate oven, 350°, for about 1 hour 10 minutes. When baked turn onto a wire rack to cool thoroughly before storing. Cut in thin slices and serve plain, toasted, or buttered. Makes 1 loaf.
*Toast coconut in a shallow pan while preheating oven. Stir frequently to insure an even golden brown color. Cool before using.
