Ione Heifers
Bring Top Price

HERMISTON—Lee Beckner of Ione topped the market at the Hermiston livestock auction Friday, with 8 yearling heifers that weighed 655 lbs., and sold for \$17.00 cwt. Delbert Anson, manager of the sale, reports, M. B. Gerking, Ione, consigned a 1015 lb. whiteface cow that sold for a top of \$13.00.

Volume was up sharply although most of the 120 consignments were small. Consigned were 437 head of cattle compared with 201 the previous Friday, 170 hogs compared with 77 and 702 sheep compared with 105. Breeding ewes were in good supply. Clarence Warren of Spray paying \$11.00 per head for 144 ewes, and more ewes are due next Friday. Particularly in demand Friday will be fleshy feeder steers, fat steers and heifers, Anson says.

Demand was generally broad and active on the part of Oregon, Washington and Idaho packers, including one new Idaho packer, with Oregon and Washington feed lots actively buying and many area farmers and ranchers buying stockers, including the ewes. Feeder steers and cows were generally up in price although the tops were due to their lower quality. All hogs were down in line with other markets due to the general decline in demand. Veal was up 95c to \$18.70 cwt., steer calves up \$1.85 to \$19.00 cwt., fat grass heifers up \$1.50 to \$19.00 cwt. Overall quality of the small consignments was generally low as odd lots were consigned.

Holstein cow, 12.40; Art Redfern, Hermiston, 675 lb. whiteface heifer, \$19.00; Clyde Nobles, Hermiston, 23 lambs, 2380 lbs., \$16.40; Carl Cox, Monument, 4 weaner pigs, \$18.00 hd.; Paul Bu-

chanan, Irrigon, 2 blackface bucks, \$34.00 hd.; Harve Simmons, Stanfield, 495 lb. whiteface heifer calf, \$18.70 cwt.; Tom Colvin, Ritter, 1675 lb. whiteface bull, \$15.30; Joe Croch, Boardman, 1390 lb. Holstein steer, \$17.10. Calves: Baby calves 2.50-19.00 hd.; weaner calves, steer calves 16.75-19.00 cwt.; heifer calves 15.75-18.70 cwt.; veal 16.10-18.70. Steers: Stocker steers 14.60-17.10 cwt.; feeder steers 17.10-19.20; fat slaughter steers, grass only 19.25-20.20; fat heifers, grass only 16.40-19.00 cwt.
