4-H and FFA Stock Bring Good Prices At Fair Auction

Prices received and quality of the 4-H and F. F. A. livestock sold at the 1954 Morrow County Fair Fat Livestock Auction, while not the highest in history, brought good returns to the 41 club members selling fat and breeding animals. Sixteen fat lambs, grading prime, choice and good, averaged 31c per pound. Twelve prime, choice and good steers averaged 37c while seven hogs brought 34½c per pound.

All buyers were local with Frank Wink and Sons from the Northwest Livestock Commission company of Hermiston supporting steers at 25c and hogs at 21c with good lambs at 16c. Harold Cohn supported prime and choice lambs at 20c. This was considerably above the market price for livestock at this quality on Friday's market. The Walla Walla Meat and Storage Company later purchased 7 steers, 4 hogs and 2 lambs from Frank Wink and Sons for slaughter.

Selling through the sale was a registered Southdown ram, a registered Rambouillet ram, 2 Tamworth Cross boars, 7 weaner pigs and a Herford bull. The Hereford bull, a FFA project raised by Ron Currin, Heppner, was purchased by Elmer Palmer for \$425.00.

The sale opened auctioning a fat lamb and breeding gilt donated with proceeds to go to the Morrow County 4-H Club for developing of the annual 4-H club camp. The lamb anonymously donated, sold to the Northwest

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
