(Continued from Page 2) this is the same as A-2 for the cost of seed and cost of seed bed preparation and seeding including the application of available nitrogen. Additional cost share agreements include \$1.00 an acre for rough tillage on the contour or cross wind to protect the summer fallow to be left over in the winter and seeded in the spring of 1955 and the payment of fifty percent of the average cost of land clearing not to exceed \$14.00 per acre. A companion cost share practice that goes along with these grass seedings is one which will recommend a seventy-five cent an acre payment for one application of 2, 4-D for annual weed control in establishing new feet of Lot Eight (8) in Blockgrass seedlings. Of course, in this

practice, legumes would not be desirable where they would be affected by the 2,4-D. The list of minimum seeding rates and eligible seeds for the A-2 and A-3 practice have been made. These seed mixtures and rates are available at the county ASC office or from this office.

FHA Announces Interest Increase In Certain Loans

Change in rates of interest for certain loans has been announced by the Farmers Home Administration. Eugene M. Denney, supervisor for Baker, Union, Wallowa, Umatilla, Morrow and Grant counties, said the interest rates for water facility loans for irrigation systems and farmstead water supplies has been changed from 3 per cent to 4 1/2 per cent per annum.

In addition, direct and insurance mortgage farm ownership loans have been increased from 4 to 4 1/2 per cent. Denney said the higher rates on the insurance mortgage loan program were needed to attract lenders to the program who complained the old rates were too low to make the program worth while.

No change will be made in the chattel loans for livestock, machinery and operating expenses, and emergency annual loans, which will remain at 5 per cent. The La Grande office is located in Room 202 of the New Foley Building, and is open week days Monday through Friday. However, Friday is set aside as Mr. Denney's regular office day for interviewing applicants and present borrowers.

Name Change Told by Local Truck Line

Portland-Pendleton Motor Transportation company, a motor freight line which has served Portland and northeast Oregon points since 1932, will change its name to Sites Freightlines effective October 1, according to Herman Sites, president. Principal reason for the change is that the line has greatly expanded the number of points served since its establishment, when Portland and Pendleton were the only termini. Sites said. The line now operates into 110 communities in northeast Oregon and southeast Washington. There has also been confusion between the name of Portland-Pendleton and another line operating into eastern Oregon, he pointed out. Simultaneously, Sites announced completion of an eight-year modernization program which has cost the firm more than half

a million dollars. Terminal facilities and offices have been completely modernized, and the company has recently added 59 new pieces of equipment.

In announcing the change of name, Sites emphasized that there has been no change in the ownership or management of the company.

"The only change will be even better service with faster equipment," he said. "We are expressing our faith in the continued growth and development of northeastern Oregon through our ex-

pansion program." Heppner is served by the Sites terminal at Pendleton, headed by Paul W. Graf.
