Angus Steers Bring Top Money

HERMISTON—Oren Brace of Heppner topped the market at the Hermiston livestock auction Friday with 11 Angus steer calves weighing 490 lbs. that sold for \$19.30 cwt. Delbert Anson, manager of the sale, reports. Don Bennett, Heppner, consigned 6 ewes and 8 baby lambs that sold for a top of \$21.00.

Volume of cattle consigned was up with 124 persons consigning small lots. Consigned were 540 cattle compared with 514 the previous Friday. 145 hogs compared with 123, and 183 sheep compared to 111.

Prices were generally steady to up slightly on cattle, except for canner-cutter, in slow demand as at other markets. Steer calves of better quality were up 80c to \$19.30 cwt., grass or grain fat slaughter steers of improved finish and quality up 40c to \$21.90 cwt., bulls up 20c to \$14.40, and heifer calves up 60c to \$17.80. Fat

lambs, lacking a week earlier returned at \$17.00, up 70c over two weeks earlier. Weaner pigs were up 50c to \$14.50 head and feeder pigs were up \$1.80 to \$24.20 cwt., but the drop in fat hogs elsewhere two weeks earlier caught up Friday, a drop of \$2.10 cwt., giving a \$20.00 top, in line with other markets.

Demand was broad and trading active except for canner-cutters. Packers an ffeedlot buyers were active, as were farmers seeking stocker heifers and light steers for grain feeding until grazing next summer. Expected next Friday are 200 range ewes. In strong demand but short supply are good grade heifers and steers, since grass cattle grade below good. Also needed are more good quality steer calves.

Gow Estate, Cecil, 975 lb. whiteface steer, \$21.90 and a 1265 lb. whiteface bull, \$14.40; Marvin Palmer, lone, 8 whiteface steer calves, 3760 lbs., \$19.10; Evelyn Woods, Hermiston, 8 lambs, 715 lbs., \$17.00; J. H. Tillman, Athena, 14 weaner pigs, \$14.50 hd.
