Mastitis Bulletin Published by OSC

Mastitis continues to be the foremost problem in dairying, says a new bulletin. "Control Mastitis in Dairy Cattle," released by the agricultural experiment station at Oregon State College. Conservative estimates place national milk losses from mastitis at more than 20 percent.

J. O. Schnautz, OSC veterinarian, who wrote the bulletin says mastitis—garget, caked udder—reduces the value of the best milk cow to carcass value.

In the bulletin, 28 questions and answers are given to explain what mastitis is, what its symptoms are, and how to control it.

Copies of the publication are available from county extension offices and OSC.

Read his reapportionment proposal in the magazine section of the Sunday Oregon Journal Feb. 22, 1953:

"Let's Merge Our Counties"

"Oregon has 36 counties. It needs no more than 8 counties at most. I (Neuberger) have drafted the first bill ever drawn to seek this unification. On Monday, Feb. 23, 1953 it is my intention to introduce in the State Senate a bill reducing Oregon to 8 counties . . .

"Article 6. American county shall consist of the present counties of Morrow, Wasco, Jefferson, Deschutes,, Crook, Wheeler, Sherman and Gilliam.

"ARTICLE 3. MULTNOMAH COUNTY SHALL HAVE ITS BOUNDARIES UNCHANGED."

Neuberger suggests consolidating Eastern Oregon counties, but leaves Multnomah County intact
