Court Proceedings for the Month of October, 1954.

The minutes of the September term were read and approved.

The Court approved the installation, operation and maintenance of flood lights on the county fair grounds. An agreement is to be prepared between Morrow County and Morrow County-Heppner Chamber of Commerce. Said lighting system is to remain the property of the Heppner-Morrow County Chamber of Commerce until it is completely paid for, thereafter it will become a part of Morrow County property holding and under the jurisdiction of the Court.

The Court ordered the amount of \$7465.00 to be transferred from the Bond Interest Fund to the Bond Sinking Fund.

The amount of \$11,406.17, was ordered transferred from the Motor License Fund to the General Road Fund by the Court.

The Court ordered the following Bangs Disease claim paid: W. Howard Cleveland, \$20.00.

The Court ordered the amount of \$25,000.00 transferred from the

Hospital Construction Fund to the General Road Fund. As soon as enough 1954-55 taxes are collected for the General Road Fund, this amount is to be returned to the Hospital Construction Fund.

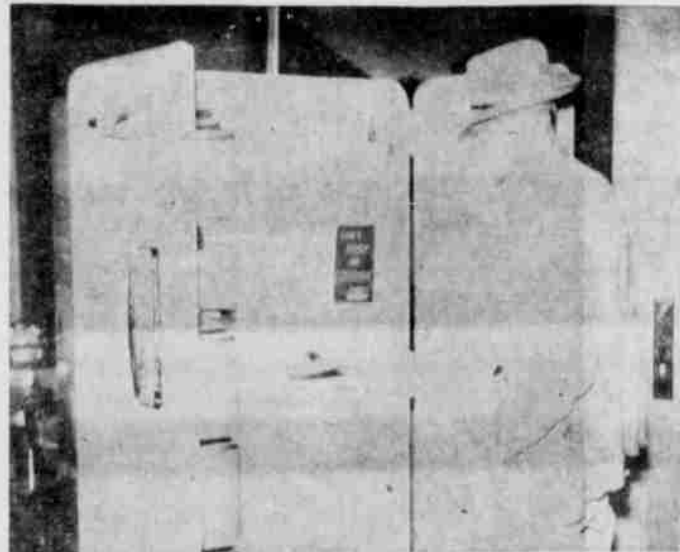
The Court ordered the sale of the following property:

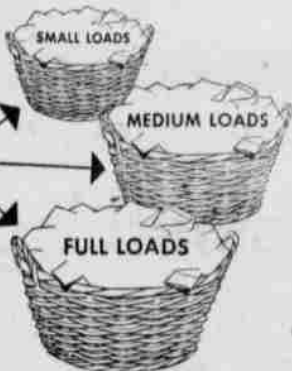

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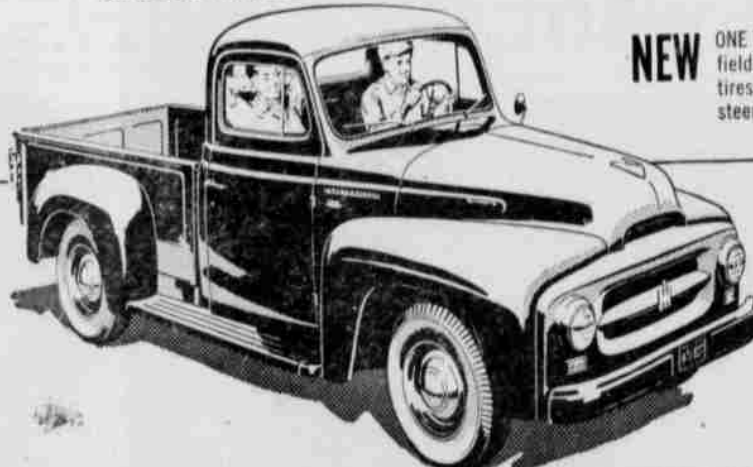

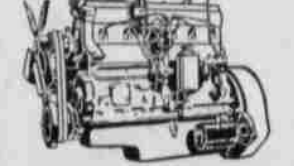
