The members discussed the possibility of assisting in taking the boys home from school that stay late for ball practice this winter. Some of them have no way home after the bus leaves.

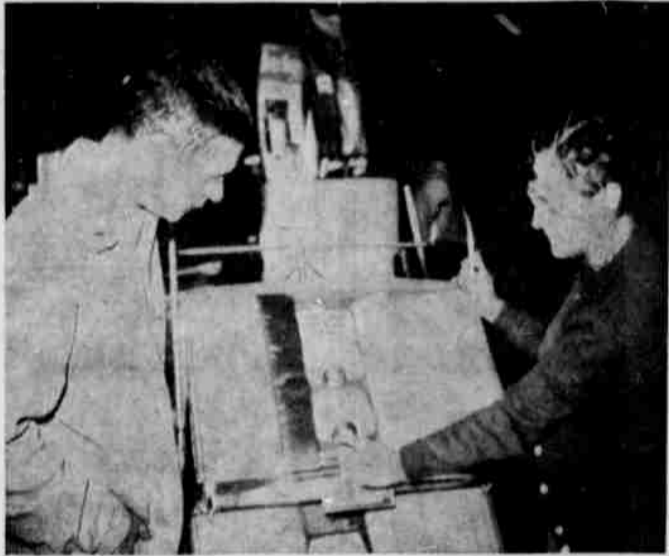
William Garner was appointed publicity chairman for the month, and Ray Anderson was appointed to see about membership cards and a motto for the club, to be reported on at the next meeting.
