CAPITOL TOO SMALL

The past ten days Oregon's \$2 million Capitol built in 1937-8 and crowded the day occupied, has been going through its biennial period of internal conversion to make way for the 1955 legislature.

More than 8000 square feet of floor space used by groups from various state departments since the 1953 legislature adjourned have been vacated and the groups crowded in tight space with other departments having seasonable space.

The Legislative Counsel, now a year-around legal operation which is the outgrowth of the Status Revision Council, will become permanently located in the
