system on extremely sandy soils. This may be more costly than surface irrigation, Shearer explains, "but it will definitely save water."

On high desert soils with short growing seasons, use of sprinkler irrigation may not be profitable. Shearer recommends a cost analysis, in such cases, before equipment is purchased. Farmers can obtain advice from their county extension agent or other qualified irrigation advisers.

4. Don't try to run water too far. Sandy soils require runs of 300 feet or less. Heavy water loss also occurs in canals and feeder ditches linking farms and water reservoirs where group action is required for moisture conservation. Shearer estimates an annual loss of 1 1/4 million acre feet of water—enough to irrigate one-fourth of Oregon's irrigated land—before it reaches the farm.

Such losses can be reduced in part by cleaning debris from the ditches and controlling velocity so that water moves as rapidly as possible without scouring or causing erosion. Shearer also recommends spraying ditch banks to kill brush that uses the water and also interferes with the flow, and sealing sections of canals where losses are especially heavy. Satisfactory sealing materials include bentonite, concrete, asphalt-impregnated materials, and clay soil where it is readily available.

Power Use Shows Big Jump in 1954 On Pacific System
Customers of Pacific Power & Light company increased their use of electricity more than 10 1/2 per cent during 1954, according to the company's annual report now being received by stockholders.

Rural customers led all others with a gain of 14.3 per cent. At the same time the average yearly household use of electric service on the Pacific Power system reached 5622 kilowatt hours, or nearly 2 1/2 times the national average.

Revenues grew 8.2 per cent over 1953, to reach \$39,952,000. Net income for the year, before provision for deferred income taxes resulting from accelerated amortization of the Yale hydro project, was \$7,989,000, and after such provision was \$5,780,000.

More than 3900 new electric customers were served from Pacific lines during the year, bringing the year-end total to 161,873. In addition, the company serves 12,500 water customers, 9320 telephone customers and 1029 steam customers.

Construction during the year cost \$11,534,000, bringing Pacific's total spent in construction since the end of World War II to \$135,000,000. Total payroll for the year, including construction, amounted to \$11,316,000, and direct taxes totaled \$5,550,000.

Looking to the future power needs of its customers, Pacific is actively working on new generating plans. These include possible additional development on the Lewis river above the existing Yale and Merwin plants, and a proposal for partnership development of the Green Peter flood control project on the Santiam. In addition, with three neighboring electric companies, it is studying other hydro sites with a potential capacity of 1,100,000 kilowatts.
