Dry Roads Scene of More Accidents Than Wet, Check Shows

There were almost twice as many accidents on dry surfaced highways and roadways in 1954 than there were on highways that were wet, icy or snowy. It has been reported by the Secretary of State's office.

A total of 37,838 accidents took place on dry surfaces as compared with 21,231 on all other types of surfaces.

Traffic officials report that extensive work is being done on informing drivers of hazardous

driving conditions and how to cope with them, but they also have an intensive program on fair weather driving.

Many of the more serious accidents are traceable to excessive speed. Under Oregon's basic rule, the driver must regulate his speed according to conditions of the road and the traffic.

Officials point out that a high speed is safe only when the driver can meet any emergency safely that may arise.
