By decree of the circuit court for Morrow County entered Dec. 12, 1910, in the matter of the determination of the relative rights to the waters of Willow Creek and its tributaries, a water right was adjudicated in the name of Andrew Reaney for the irrigation of 20 acres in NE 1/4 Sec. 28, T. 1 S., R. 25 E., W. M., from Willow Creek with a date of priority of April 1890 and in the name of Margaret Reaney for the irrigation of 18 acres in SW 1/4 NE 1/4, 5.5 acres in NE 1/4 NW 1/4, 8 acres in SE 1/4 NW 1/4 and 1.5 acres in NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Sec. 28, T. 1 S., R. 25 E., W. CATTLE PRICES AGAIN EDGE UP HERMISTON—Franklin Ely of Ione topped the market at the Hermiston livestock auction Friday with three grain-fed white-face heifers weighing 2465 lbs. that sold for \$22.50 cwt., Delbert Anson, manager of the sale, reports.

Prices at the auction were fully steady to stronger Friday. Better quality and an unusually large number of Oregon and Washington packers and farmers, as well as a good number of feeders, contributed to the broad and active demand accounting in part for increases.

Volume was relatively steady, 443 cattle compared with 476 the previous Friday, 190 hogs compared with 179, and 52 sheep compared with 256.

Veal of better quality met continued demand, the fatter veal bringing \$28 cwt., up 75c. Other price increases included baby calves, \$33 hd., up \$1; stocker steers, \$18.20 cwt., up 30c; feeder steers, \$20.40 cwt., up 10c; fat heifers, \$20.50 cwt., up 40c; dairy cows, better quality, \$172.50, up \$2.50 hd.; stock cows, better quality, strong demand, \$157.50 pr., up \$32.50; commercial cows \$15.80 cwt., up 20c; weaner pigs \$14 hd., up 75c; feeder pigs \$19.30 cwt up 10c; fat hogs \$16.50 cwt., up 80c; boars, \$9.75, up 65c cwt.; feeder lambs \$14.60 cwt., up 40c; bucks \$14.20 cwt., up 70c.

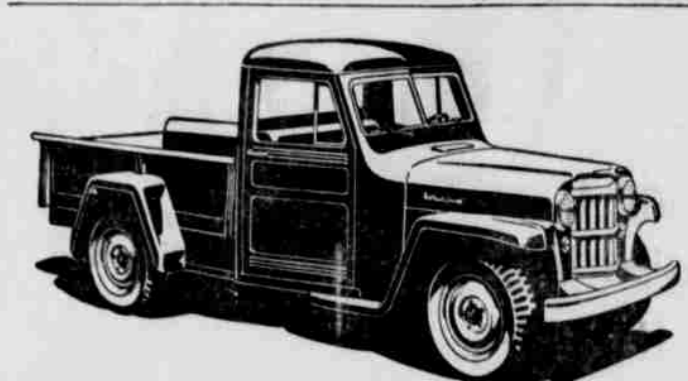
