CAPITAL PARADE Continued from Page 2 ployment Compensation Commission reports. This is about 10 per cent above last year. ACCOLADE TO GOVERNOR Governor Paul L. Patterson received word Monday that he had been appointed a member of the 30th anniversary committee which came from the president of

the board of trustees, Salem L. Buxton, Eaton Rapids, Michigan. Thirty-five governors are members of the committee, Vice President Nixon is honorary chairman. Founded in 1925 by the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the National Home was provided for 1 or 1500 children. The Home includes community center, hospital, chapel of all faiths, nursery and 50 acres of farm, orchard and dairy land. The children are housed in modern cottages under supervision of house mothers. After graduation from local high school scholarships are available to assist them in attending college or trade school.

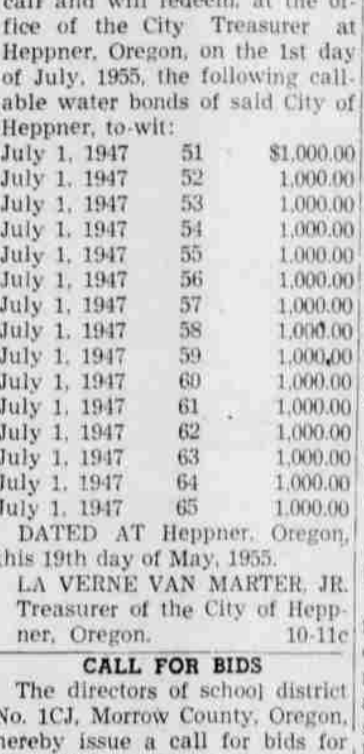
COMPILING NEW LAWS Laws passed by the 1955 Legislature are being compiled by David O'Hara, of the State Elections Bureau and his staff. O'Hara said he hopes to have all available laws, except those with the emergency clause, processed before the first week in August. Laws which include the emergency clause become effective when signed by the governor and filed with the secretary of state. SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR During the past week Governor Patterson signed the following bills passed by the late legislature: Prohibiting contests involving the catching for fish in fish derbies. Allowing the attorney general five additional employees to cooperate with Public Welfare Commission officials in investigating and prosecuting persons for non-support and violation of PWC laws. Providing a method of candidates and party officials to obtain recounts of election results. Compel counties to pay damages caused by changes in highway grades. Prohibit comic book wholesalers from forcing dealers to accept obscene and crime books in order to obtain other books.

Lamb Market Due For Ups and Downs More than usual ups and downs are likely in the lamb market says agricultural outlook specialists at Oregon State college. They believe the recent rush of lambs to market points toward a possible lull. If this happens, prices should pick up. If it lasts through June, as now seems quite possible, the lull could lead to bunched marketings and a sharp price break in July. Usually, Oregon's spring lamb marketings increase and prices start breaking around Memorial Day. This year, the cold, wet spring has slowed pastures, de-

laid spring lambs and caused old crop lambs to be held longer than usual. The old crop is cleaning up now but most of the new crop will not be ready for awhile. Early lambs in other areas have already been sold. Poor pasture conditions hurried California, Arizona, and Texas lambs to market faster than usual. Picking the right time to sell lambs will require close study of conditions here and elsewhere, but time spent this way can pay well, the specialists conclude.
