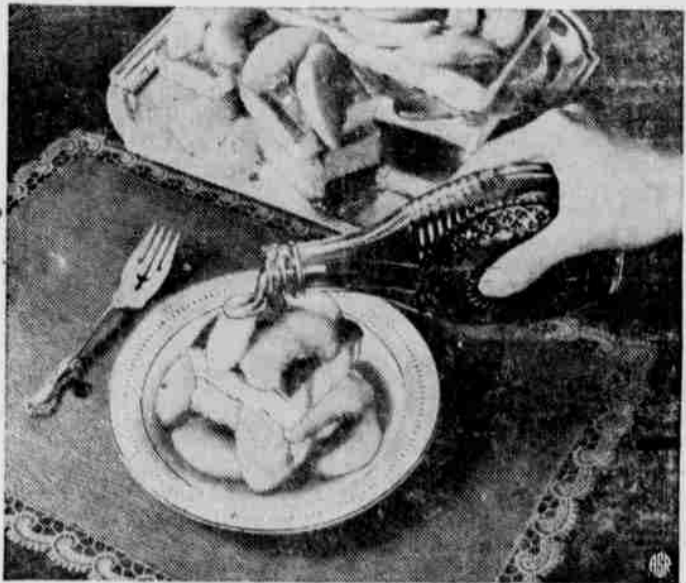

### Peach Cake At Best With Maple Pour-On



A Peach Shortcake served with the smooth, rich-tasting, summer pour-on, maple-blended syrup, is just the thing for gals who theorize "time's a-wasted in the kitchen when friends get together for a visit." The cake itself, if made with a mix, can be baked quickly in the morning. Then right before refreshment time, add the peaches. The syrup goes right to the table; it pours so easily and its bottle makes an attractive addition to the table. You'll find this syrup a popular pour-on for ice cream and puddings, too.

Here is the recipe for "Maple Peach Shortcake"... remember you can't beat it as a lazy day dessert.

**Maple Peach Shortcake**  
1/2 package (2 1/2 cups unsifted) instant yellow cake mix  
1/2 cup water  
1 egg, unbeaten  
Fresh peaches, sliced  
Maple-blended syrup

Measure cake mix into small bowl. Add water and egg. Beat 2 minutes until smooth and creamy. Pour batter into 8x8x2-inch square pan, which has been lined on bottom with paper. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 30 to 35 minutes. Cool cake; then split into two layers. Spread sliced peaches between layers and on top of cake. Cut in squares and pour syrup over each serving.
