The Rev. A. E. Davis, pastor of the Methodist church in Hermiston, performed the candle-light service before an altar decorated with baskets of white gladioli.
Mrs. Thurman Johnson sang "Love You, Truly", "Because", and "Wedding Prayer", the latter as the couple knelt at the altar. She was accompanied by Mrs. Frank Marlow, who also played the wedding marches.

The bride, given in marriage by her father, was lovely in a gown of white satin fashioned with fitted bodice and sweetheart neckline, with long sleeves trimmed in tiny covered buttons, and the bodice trimmed with seed pearls and rhinestones. The full skirt extended to a brush train. The finger tip veil of illusion net edged with seed pearls fell from a lace crown. The bride carried a white orchid on a white Bible.

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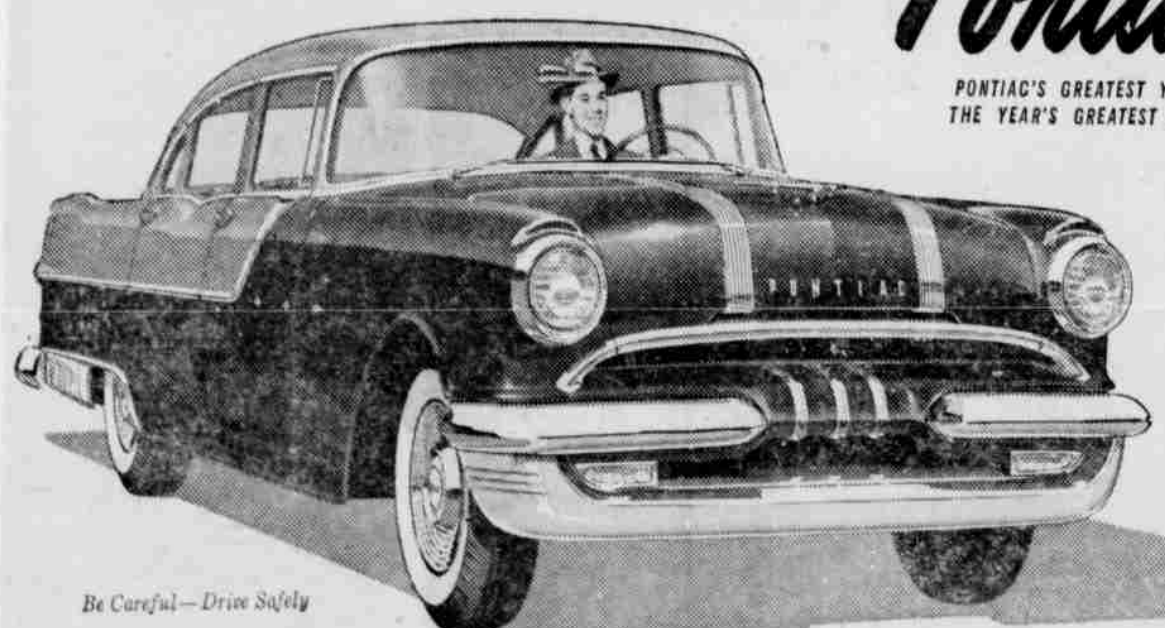
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
