### RIETMANN-HURST WEDDING HELD IN ARLINGTON CHURCH SUNDAY

A very beautiful pink and white ceremony in the Arlington Methodist church Sunday afternoon united in marriage Marilyn Ann Hurst, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Roy E. Hurst and Billy Joe Rietmann, son of Mr. and Mrs. Victor Rietmann of Ione. Dr. Edward Terry, Portland, superintendent of the Portland district of the Methodist church, read the double ring ceremony.

Pink gladioli and white chrysanthemums were used in the large urns on either side of the altar with pink rosebuds in the altar vases. While on either side of the altar were the same flowers, with arrangements of the same on the organ and piano. In the windows were pink dahlias and white chrysanthemums centered with a pink candle. On the pews, tied with pale pink ribbon, streamers, were bouquets of pink gladioli.

Ed Bradshaw of Portland, sang "At Dawning" and "Because" preceding the ceremony and "The Wedding Benediction" as the couple knelt for the blessing. He sang "Through the Years" at the close of the ceremony. Mrs. A. N. Boyer accompanied Mr. Bradshaw and also played the wedding marches.

The Triple Link club of Sans Souci Rebekah lodge met at the home of Mrs. Adelle Hannan on September 19.

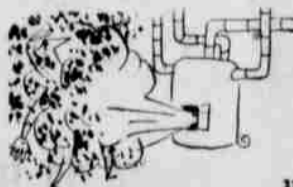
Plans were made for a card party to be held at the IOOF hall on Thursday, September 29 at 8:00 p. m.
