Continued from Page 2 an Orford Wasatch cross yielded 15.8, Brevor 15.6, Orfed 15, Golden 14.3, Rio 14.2.

Next year's nursery will have some new varieties. They will be seeded in the Eightmile and Ione nurseries again sometime after the first of October. Varieties to be grown for the 1955-1956 crop year are Rio, Kharkof, Golden, Elmar, Omar, Brevor, Orfed, Requa, and Rex as the establish-

ed varieties, with six promising crosses; the new Rio-Rex Nebred cross which has recently been named Columbia will be included. Others are 7-15 x Rex-Rio, Orfed x Wasatch, Omar x Orfed, Norin 10 x Brevor, and Athena x Blackhull Rex. In these crosses there are some promising possibilities for new varieties.
