grading by John Landers, Oregon State College livestock specialist. A judging contest will follow this with four beef classes and two classes of hogs.

Morrow county's 4-H livestock judging team that will attend Pacific International, will have the opportunity to do some practice judging at this time. The program for the morning will be concluded with a discussion on new breeds of meat type hogs. The group is invited to bring their sack lunch and to have lunch at the Green farm.

The afternoon program consists of livestock disease discussion and management demonstration by Veterinarian Dr. Wayne Klier. A showmanship demonstration, horn weight demonstration, bull profiling, finish grading and a discussion of cow and calf records will conclude the afternoon program. The F. S. and Stanley Green farm is located on the loop road about eight miles north-east of Stanfield.

Considerable interest is being shown this fall by club members in fat steer projects. Two steers are on feed now for the Oregon Wheat Grower's League sponsored, fat stock show and sale, which will be held at The Dalles in early June. Club members Larry Campbell, Echo and Roland Ekstrom, lone have Hereford calves on feed. Roland Ekstrom

is feeding out one of his own breeding, while Larry Campbell purchased his Hereford steer from the John Graves herd last week. Several 4-H Club members who plan to take steers to this show are now looking for heavier steers suitable for finishing out by this early June date. Other club members will select steers next month as herds come in from pastures and range for weaning.

A group of 4-H parents gathered Sunday at the 4-H club camp on Herron Creek to work on the summer camp building which was started last June. During the day the group rat proofed and sided the building as well as making other improvements on the kitchen and storage room facilities. 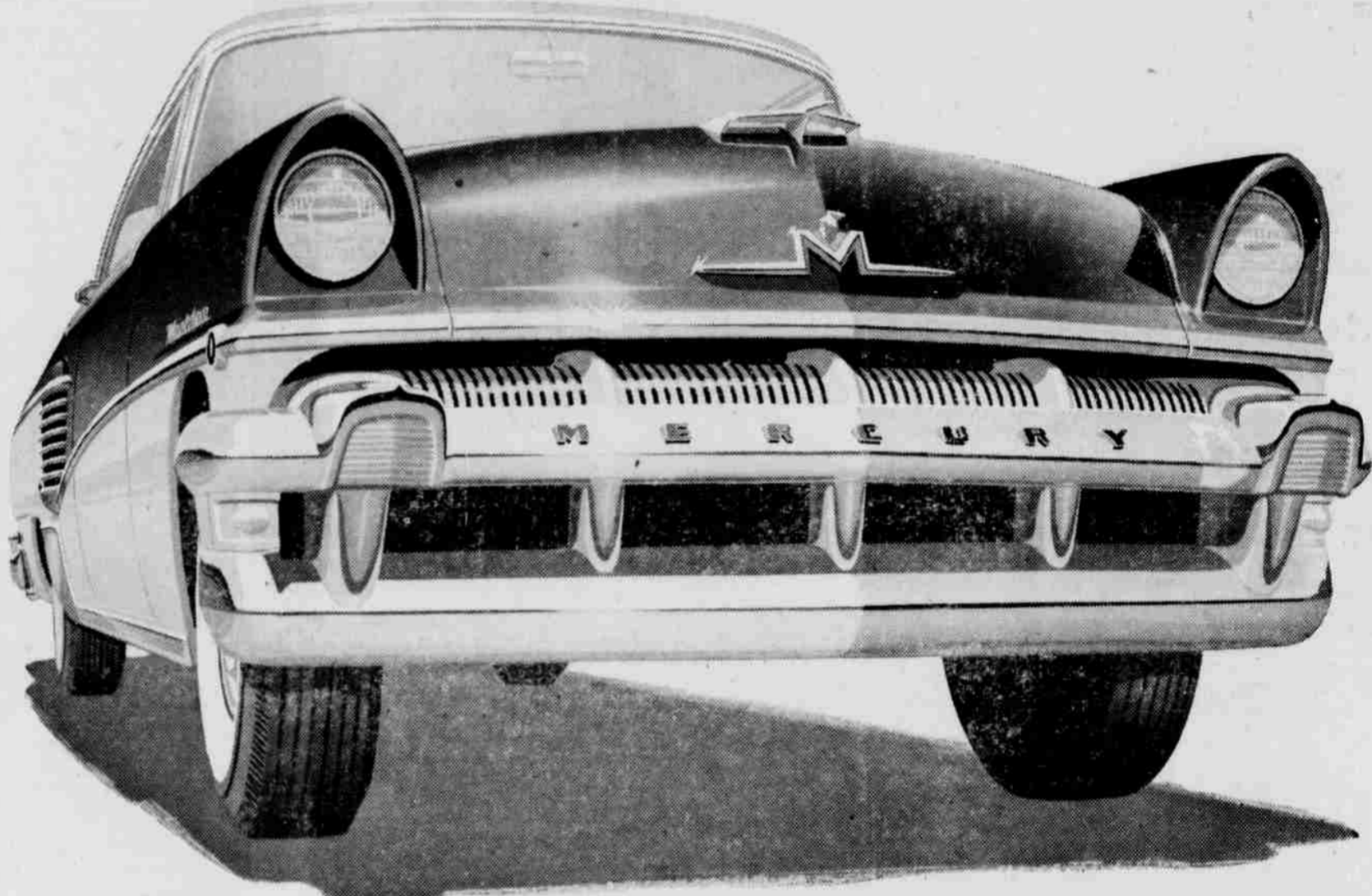

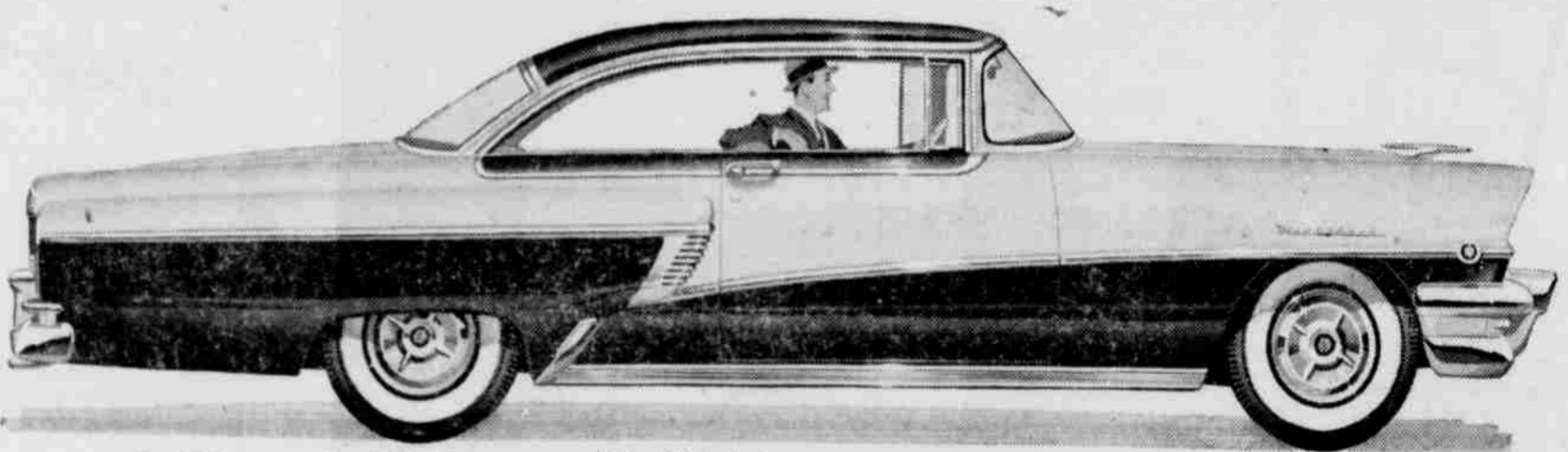
