Doughnuts are on display at neighborhood grocery stores and bakeries. Halloween, you know! If you like to make your own—

Here is a basic DOUGHNUT RECIPE

Beat 4 egg yolks or 2 whole eggs until light. Add 1 cup sugar, 2 T. melted butter, % cup milk. Sift together: 3% cups sifted all-purpose flour or 4 cups pastry flour, 4 t. baking powder, 1 t. salt. % t. nutmeg, % t. cinnamon. Add dry ingredients to liquid and mix together until well blended. Chili dough. Roll to % inch thickness, Cut with floured cutter. Fry in heated fat —375°. Side doughnuts from spatula into hot fat. Fry on each side until golden brown. Remove, drain on absorbent paper.

SPECIAL TRICKS FOR

DOUGHNUT TREATS: Drench warm doughnuts in granu-lated or powdered sugar, add clima-mon or chopped nuts, too, if you like. Try adding 3 tablespoons grated orange rind and substitute orange judice for the liquid. While warm, dip these is powdered sugar. Add maple flavoring and chopped nuts, serve warm with scoop of vanilia or maple-nut less cream. Lazy? Drop spoonfuls into hot fat and have drop doughnuts.
