The object of the program will be to increase the rainfall in the areas outlined below. The equipment to be used will be silver iodide (AgI) coke burning generators. FOR SECRETARY OF STATE

State Senator Mark Hatfield will be a candidate for the Republican nomination for Secretary of State next May if President Eisenhower does not run for reelection.

Before the president's illness the Marion County senator intended to run for a seat in the Republican presidential nominating convention and work for Eisenhower's nomination, as he did in 1952.

Senator Hatfield and William L. Phillips, both of Salem, led the petition crusade which resulted in a solid Oregon delegation for Eisenhower at Chicago.

UNEMPLOYMENT DECREASES
The active number of job seekers declined to 15,000 in October according to records of the state unemployment compensation commission revealed Friday.

This is the lowest in more than three years. The improved conditions were strongest in the Portland area during the past three weeks.

Non-agricultural employment continued close to the record of 495,700 working in August 1952, during the height of the presidential campaign.

Estimates for both August and September approached the half-million mark and may establish an all-time record when complete reports are received.

REPUBLICAN YEARBOOK
The first name on the order book for the Republican Yearbook is that of Governor Paul L. Patterson. He signed up Friday when solicited by Republican county chairmen.

The party book will contain a history of the Republican party in Oregon and is scheduled to be ready for delivery three months after solicitations close November 4, this year.

Democratic leaders in the Capital area were quick to promise that they would have their version of the GOP history in Oregon about the same date.

SAMMONS HONORED
What Gov. Patterson termed "the first step in the 1955 safe driving program sponsored by the president's committee for traffic safety" was made Thursday when

the governor received from E. C. Sammons acceptance of his gubernatorial appointment as director of Safe Driving Day in Oregon, December 1.

Sammons is president of the United States National Bank of Portland and president of the Highway Lifesavers Committee of Oregon Citizens, Inc.

Safe driving will be observed statewide in Oregon Gov. Patterson said and added that success of the project will be determined in a large measure, by the effectiveness of community action throughout the state.

"I have written to Oregon mayors urging them to issue proclamations designating Safe Driving Day and appealing for their active support."

W. U. PROF HONORED
Dr. Chester Kaiser, associate professor of history at Willamette University, has been named governor of the Oregon province of Pi Gamma Mu National Social Honor Society.

The society is affiliated with the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the National Academy of Economics and Political Science. As governor is appointed for each state for four years to promote the society program and call conventions.

TO NATIONAL MEETING

Bernard Mainwaring, editor and publisher of the Capital Journal, Salem, accompanied by Mrs. Mainwaring left for East Lansing, Mich. Saturday. He will represent the Oregon State Board of Higher Education at a meeting of the Association of Governing Boards of American Colleges and Universities.

The Salem Editor is a member of the state board. The Mainwarings expect to return about October 26.
