Minimum on Monday was eight above, and maximum 22. A trace more of snow fell during the night, but the sun shone during the day. Tuesday morning brought more cold, with most thermometers registering about 15 degrees colder than Monday. Coldest reported was eight below. The fog came in and was frozen on wires and trees.

4-H Club News

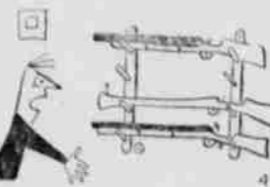
CAMP COOKERY CLUB NO. 1
