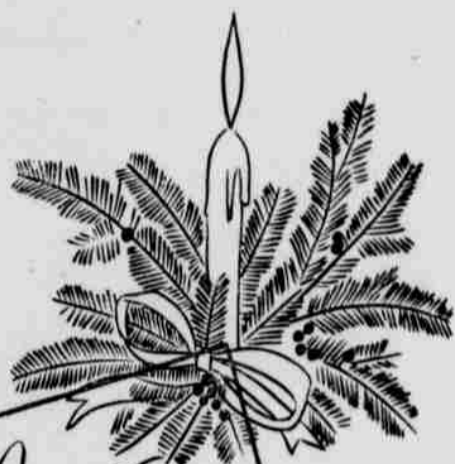

Kenneth Brenner underwent surgery in Portland last week. His mother, Mrs. C. E. Brenner is with him.



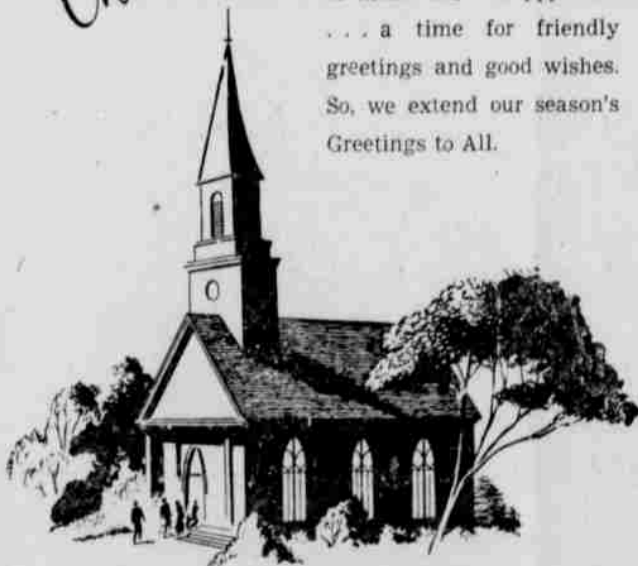
WA CAN TE KA CAMP FIRE GIRLS
