Weed Control Meet For Road Workers Scheduled in March

A series of one-day weed control meetings for highway maintenance works and commercial chemical weed control men has been scheduled over the state during March, reports Rex Warren, farm crop specialist at Oregon State college.

Each meeting will open at 9:30 a. m. and include discussions of the Oregon herbicide law, highway spray recommendations, uses of herbicides, ways to reduce the spray hazards, and problems encountered in spraying weeds and brush.

An examination for the herbicide applicators license will be held during the afternoon session of each meeting. Under the Oregon herbicide law, all commercial applicators must be licensed by the state department of agriculture. Questions to be covered in the exam will be discussed during the morning session.

Purpose of the meetings is to bring state and county road crews and commercial applicators up-to-date on safe uses of herbicides, especially on state highways. Use of weed control chemicals on roadsides around the state lowers maintenance costs and helps provide unobstructed vision at corners and intersections.

Correct handling of herbicides to protect farmers and property-owners from possible damage during spraying is also stressed at the meetings, which are open to the public. The programs are sponsored by the state department of agriculture, state highway department, and Oregon State college extension service.

More information on the examination, and on license requirements, can be obtained from Ray Kelso, state department of agriculture, Salem.
