

ORDINANCE

An Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance to provide for the fixing of a time and place for a public hearing on the question of the annexation of certain contiguous territory to the City of Boardman, and dispensing with submitting this question to the registered voters of the City of Boardman."

WHEREAS, it is the determination and opinion of the Common Council of the City of Boardman that for the peace, health and public advantage of the inhabitants of the City of Boardman and of the proposed territory to be annexed that a certain territory contiguous to the City of Boardman be annexed to said City, and that the Common Council does elect to dispense with submitting the question of such annexation to the registered voters of the City, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary therefore, that at a time and place be fixed for a public hearing before the Common Council of the City of Boardman at which time the registered voters of the said City may appear and be heard on the question of such annexation.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF BOARDMAN DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. The Common Council of the City of Boardman, Oregon does hereby elect to dispense with submitting to the registered voters of the City of Boardman the question of the annexation of the hereinafter described contiguous territory to the City of Boardman, Oregon.

SECTION II. That a public hearing is hereby called to be held before the Common Council of the City of Boardman, Oregon on the 4th day of April, 1956 at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M., Oregon Standard Time at the Greenfield Grange Hall in said City at which time the registered voters of the City of Boardman may appear and be heard on the question of the annexation of the hereinafter described territory which is contiguous to the present boundary of said City.

SECTION III. That notice of said hearing shall be given by publication prior to said hearing once a week for two successive weeks in the Heppner Gazette Times, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Boardman and the territory proposed to be annexed. This notice shall

also be given by posting notices of said hearing in four public places in the City of Boardman, Oregon, for a like period. Said Notice shall read substantially as follows:

Notice is hereby given: that by virtue of an Ordinance of the Common Council of the City of Boardman, Oregon, duly adopted the 5th day of March, 1956, and published in the Heppner Gazette Times, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Boardman, a public hearing will be held at the Greenfield Grange Hall, in the City of Boardman, on the 4th day of April 1956, at the hour of 8 o'clock, P. M., Oregon Standard Time, before the Common Council of the City of Boardman, at which time the registered voters of the City of Boardman may appear and be heard on the question of the annexation of the following described contiguous territory to the City of Boardman.

Commencing at the Northwest corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 8, T. 4 N, R. 25 EWM, thence South 0° 24' East 1325.11 feet to the Southwest corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of said Section 8, thence North 0° 04' West 1323.52 feet following the North-South center line of said Section 8, to the center of said Section 8, thence North 89° 49' West 1329.40 feet, following the East-West center line of said Section 8, this being a portion of the South boundary line of the City of Boardman, to the point of beginning. All being in Section 8, T. 4 N, R. 25 EWM Morrow County, Oregon.

All being in Section 8, T. 4 N, R. 25 EWM, Morrow County, Oregon.

M., said point being the Southeast corner of the City of Boardman, Oregon, thence East to the Southeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of said Section 8, thence North to the South meander line of the Columbia River, thence West following the said South meander line of the Columbia River to the West boundary line of said Section 8, thence South along said West boundary line of Section 8, to the Northwest corner of the City of Boardman, thence Easterly along the North boundary line of the City of Boardman, to the North-South center line of Section 8, thence South along said center line and the East boundary line of the City of Boardman to the point of beginning. All being in Section 8, T. 4 N, R. 25 EWM, Morrow County, Oregon.
