Sunflower Growing Contest Sponsored By One Garden Club

The Ione Garden Club is sponsoring a sunflower growing contest for the grade school and seeds will be distributed next week. The committee in charge of the contest is Mrs. Sarah Aldrich, Mrs. Phil Emert and Mrs. Fred Martin.

The rules are as follows:
1. Grow seeds given by the garden club. 2. Must be planted and cared for by child receiving the seeds. 3. One stalk must be exhibited in the fall flower show. Judging will be based on size, color, stem and leaves. These points will be considered: tall, stiff stem, bright, clear color; freshness. 5. Prizes will go to contestants by rooms in which they are enrolled as of April 1956. Appropriate garden prizes will be given to first place winners in each division. Ribbons will be given to second and third place winners. 6. Divisions: 1. Pre-school and First grade. 2. Second and Third grades. 3. Fourth and Fifth grades. 4. Sixth and seventh grades.

Directions for Growing Sunflowers
1. Choose a sunny spot. 2. Prepare soil deeply; rake fine. 3. Plant seeds 1 inch deep, two to three feet apart. 4. Water well. Keep moist until plants appear (about 10 days). 5. Stake, as they should grow from 5 to 10 feet tall. (Sunflowers will grow in any garden soil, but are deep and heavy feeders. They like plenty of fertilizer, sun and water.)

Directions For Exhibitor
1. Cut the evening before the show. Only one stalk to a contestant. 2. Cut stalk at an angle. 3. Put in container of water immediately.
