some remodeling done on her home on Second street. Clarence Royer of Pendleton is doing the work.

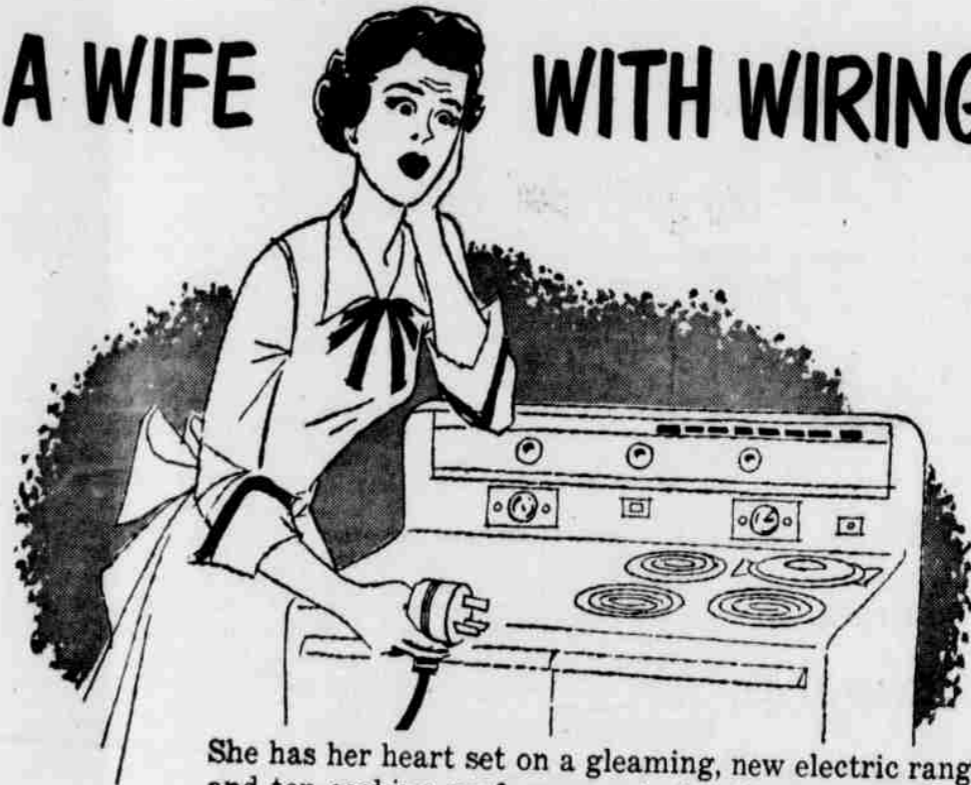
NOTICE OF BUDGET MEETING OF THE CITY OF HEPPNER, OREGON
