There are many nice things to remember or to look forward to with happy thoughts about summer. One of the nicest is the occasion for outdoor meals. Here's an ideal menu that's easy to prepare:

- Lamb Shish Kabobs
- Prepackaged Cooked Rice
- Fruit Salad
- Iced Tea

Of course, no outdoor summer meal would be complete without the all-time favorite beverage—iced tea. Just to look at a tall frosted pitcher of ice tea immediately conjures up in one's mind the pleasures of relaxing and enjoying one's self while the cool, refreshing liquid trickles down one's throat.

Here's a new way to make iced tea that cuts the preparation time in half, and also requires less ice cubes. Bring one quart of freshly drawn cold water to a full, rolling boil in a saucepan. Remove from heat and while the water is still bub-

bling, immediately add 1/2 cup loose tea. Brew 5 minutes. Stir and strain into a pitcher holding one quart of cold water. Serve in ice-filled glasses with sugar and lemon to taste.

To make Lamb Shish Kabobs combine 1/2 cup of each of chopped onion, olive oil, red wine (optional), 1 minced clove of garlic, 1 tablespoon salt, and 1 teaspoon black pepper in a Dutch oven. Marinate 2 1/2 pounds lamb shoulder cut in 2-inch cubes overnight. Turn into Dutch oven, simmer covered for 1 hour or until lamb is almost tender. Wash and prepare the following vegetables: 4 firm tomatoes, cut in half; 2 green peppers, quartered, and 8 mushrooms. Arrange on 8 skewers as follows: lamb, green pepper, lamb, tomato, lamb, mushroom. Brush with marinade and broil or grill, turning and brushing frequently until lamb is crusted brown. Serve remaining sauce over rice. Makes 8 servings.
