Safeguards Urged For Farm Ponds; Checklist Given

You can't beat a farm pond for fishing, boating and swimming, says Andy Landforce, wildlife management specialist at Oregon State college. But a pond can become a danger spot on your

600,000 4-H'ers Hunt Hazards



SAFETY is an important crop that's being harvested on the farms and in the homes of 600,000 4-H Club members taking part in the 1956 National 4-H Safety Program.

Through 4-H projects and activities, club members in all 48 states are correcting hazards which are responsible for an annual toll of 14,000 lives and 1,200,000 serious injuries among farm residents, and an economic loss estimated to be a billion-and-a-half dollars.

4-H'ers conduct surveys to locate hazards, and then correct unsafe conditions. They present demonstrations on a wide variety of topics pertaining to farm, home and highway safety, and members give talks over radio and television and before group meetings. In addition, club members build booths and displays for exhibiting at fairs and in store windows.

Realizing that motor vehicle accidents are responsible for

over 40 percent of all accidental deaths among farm people, 4-H'ers are increasing their participation in motor vehicle safety.

In recognition of the outstanding safety work done by 4-H members, General Motors is again providing incentives in the 1956 National 4-H Safety Award Program. Included in the awards offered are four gold-filled medals for winners in each county; an all-expense trip to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago for the state winner; and \$300 college scholarship for the eight national winners. Certificates and plaques are also provided for clubs reporting outstanding safety programs on county and state levels.

The 4-H Safety Program is conducted by the Cooperative Extension Service, and the awards arranged by the National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work. Complete information on the program is available from county Extension offices.

Cattle Prices Holding Steady

HERMISTON — Cattle prices leveled off at the Hermiston Livestock Commission Co. sale Friday after four weeks of steady gain.

Grass fat steers, after posting a high of \$20.40 cwt. last week, dropped to a top of \$18.30 cwt. with quality down corresponding. Grass fat heifers and veal also tailed off but other cattle remained steady.

Hogs, on the other hand, scored good gains with top feeder pigs bringing \$17 cwt. compared with \$15.75 cwt. for the previous week. Fat hogs set a high mark of \$19.20 cwt. to beat the season's best price of \$19.10 cwt. posted two weeks ago.

Seventy-wrist consignors placed 349 cattle, 89 hogs and 293 sheep on the auction block in what manager Delbert Anson described as a nice fast moving market.

Feeder steers in large quantities will be needed for next week's sale, Anson announced.

farm without safeguards.

This is particularly true in the summertime when many farm families are going swimming to beat the heat. The farm pond is often the most convenient swimming hole in the neighborhood. And swimming in farm ponds can be particularly dangerous. Landforce points out, because there's often a lack of supervision for children and because swimmers frequently aren't well trained.

Here are some hints from Landforce to keep your farm pond a recreation spot you'll remember with pleasure rather than sorrow:

1. Be sure small children don't have an opportunity to play in or near the pond by themselves.
2. Set a rule that all non-swimmers wear life preservers, and enforce it.
3. Keep simple rescue equipment close at hand. A long light-weight pole such as bamboo, a 10-foot plank of light, dry wood, or an inner tube can be extended or thrown to a person in distress. Keep a rope tied to the equipment you have so you can tow the victim safely to shore.
4. If your pond is used a lot for swimming, it's a good idea to keep a boat handy.

Landforce adds one other hint to the list—Parents should teach their children to respect water as soon as the children are old enough to understand. And, children should be taught to swim as soon as possible.
