Blend 1 cup soft shortening, 1½ cups sugar, 2 eggs. Sift together and stir in 2¼ cups enriched Oregon flour, 2 tsp. cream of tartar, 1 tsp. soda and ½ tsp. salt. Mix in 1 cup ground filberts or walnuts, chili dough. Roll into "walnut-size" balls. Roll in mixture of 1 tsp. sugar and 2 tsp. cinnamon. Place 2 inches apart on greased baking sheet. Bake at 400° 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned but still soft.

Eastern Oregon Shrub Quiz Leaflet Issued

An easy guide to identifying 30 Eastern Oregon shrubs is now available in a single-sheet circular published by the Oregon State college extension service.

Titled, "Eastern Oregon Shrub Quiz", the circular lists and has pictures of the foliage of 30 different shrubs found east of the Cascades. Persons taking the quiz are asked to name the shrubs from the pictures. An accompanying circular gives answers to the quiz.
