two parties and their candidates in this super apastic campaign: Dwight D. Eisenhower is president.

Adlai E. Stephenson is "the captain who lost his ship" in 1952.

1952 was not a Republican year—it was an Ike year, only the GOP lost the Congress and some governors.

By his mid-term (1949-1953) President Harry Truman had been given such a thorough hatchet job by the 80-percent Republican press that anyone else anybody could think of was welcome as his successor by a large majority of the voters.

Then came Ike, a fresh and new candidate—"A hero we got," with the keenest, briefest, double-edged political slogan ever devised, "I Like Ike." A GOP song hit, it was etched on their chests and war chests. Subconsciously it was translated to, "And We Don't Like Harry."

Until late August there was little trend that gave Stevenson supporters hope that he would be a highly successful campaigner. Since then and particularly since reports of increasing Democratic gains in voter registrations, a groundswell for the Democrats has been growing and Adlai has got into a vote-winning stride.
