The object of the program will be to increase the rainfall in the areas outlined below. The equipment to be used will be silver iodide (AgI) coke burning generators. The fuel used will be coke impregnated with silver iodide (AgI). The boundaries for the area to be affected are as follows: Starting at the east county line of Morrow County, midway of Section 4, Twp. 3 N., Rge. 27 E., thence west-southwest along the county road to the southwest corner of Section 35, twp. 3 N., Rge. 27 E., thence west to the county line between Morrow and Gilliam Counties, thence south-southeast along State Highway 74 to the southwest corner of Section 31, Twp. 1 S., Rge. 26 E., thence east to the Umatilla County line, thence north and west along the Morrow-Umatilla County boundary to the point of beginning.

The operation will be from approximately November 15, 1956 to June 30, 1957. The area to be affected by the rain increase program will be same as the above description.
