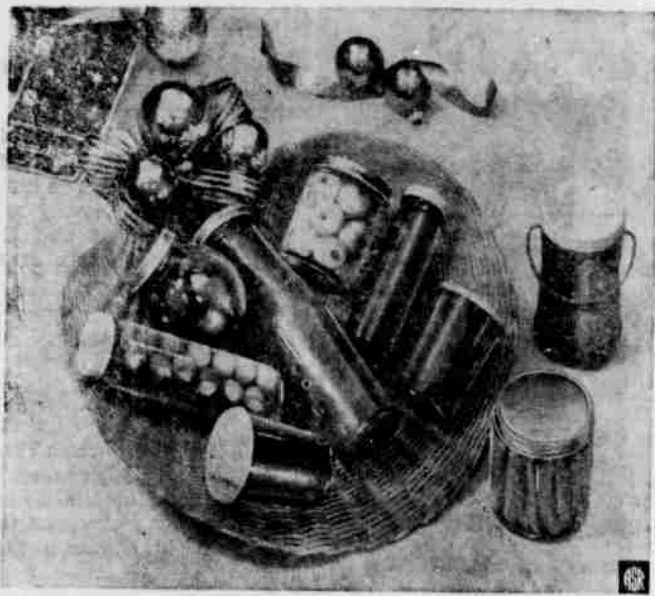
**Health Project**

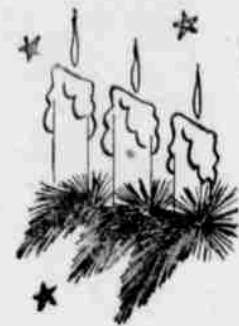

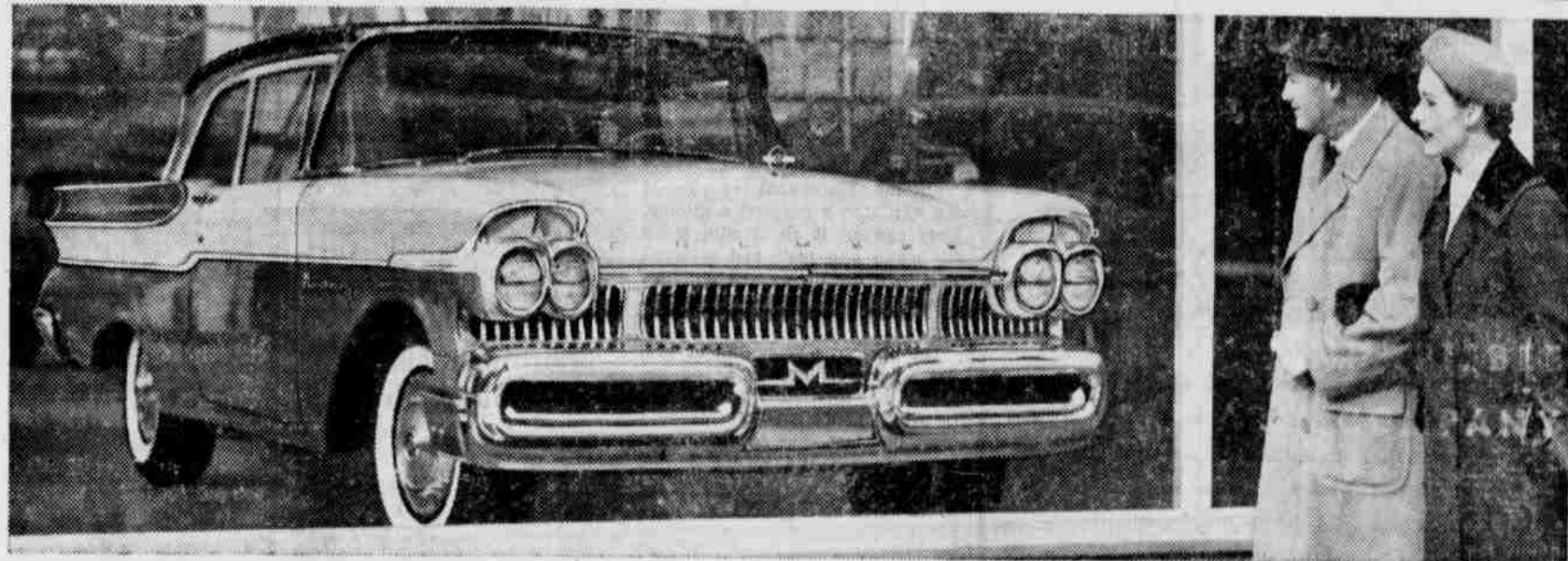
**Sports News**
