Norway Sardine-Macaroni Casserole



Brisk autumn and winter breezes call for hot nourishing main dishes such as this. Aside from its economical advantage and savory flavor, Norway sardines and macaroni casserole boasts the ease of preparation which homemakers can rely on with convenient canned products, in this case Norway sardines and tomato sauce.

INGREDIENTS
2 (2 1/2 oz.) cans Norway sardines
1 (8 oz.) package macaroni
1 green pepper
1/4 lb. American cheese sliced
1 (4 oz.) can tomato sauce
Seasoning to taste
Seasoning to taste

Butter a medium casserole or baking dish. Cook macaroni according to package directions and drain when tender. Finely chop the green pepper. In the casserole, arrange a layer of macaroni and top with half the amount of the above ingredients, reserving the tomato sauce. In this order: sardines, chopped green pepper and cheese. Season to taste. Repeat procedure, reserving half can of sardines, and ending with top layer of cheese. Arrange remaining sardines in the shape of a star on top of cheese and pour over tomato sauce. Bake for 45 minutes in moderate oven (375-degree F.). Yields 4 generous servings.
