SLANTS- (Continued from page 2) has announced his intention of eliminating many boards and commissions, and since appointments to the interim committee will be made entirely by democrats, the resulting committee cannot help but be a biased group. Objections were also raised to the wording of the resolution. After an attempt to rerefer the bill to State and Federal Affairs failed 20 to 33, it was passed with 36 in favor of it, 17 opposed. On Wednesday HJM 2, memorializing Congress for immediate construction of Hells Canyon Dam, died a long and wordy death in the Senate. The argument lasted all morning and a part of the afternoon session and resulted in a tie vote, which automatically killed it. A motion then made to rerefer it was ruled out of order. Memorials seldom receive so much attention.
