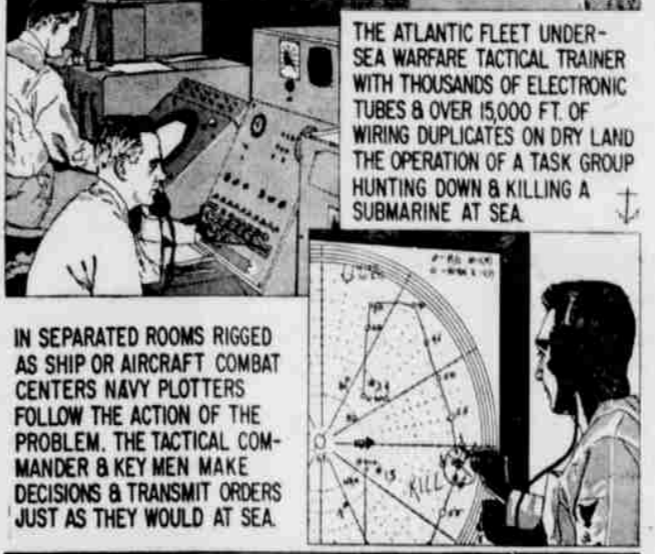

Oregon now ranks 18th in the nation for gross business of farm cooperatives. California led the nation last year with nearly \$830 million. Total business for all farm cooperatives of the nation passed the \$9 1/2 billion mark last year, an increase of about 1 1/2 percent over the previous year. Marketing accounts for about 75 percent of the nation's farmer cooperative business with dairy products and grain the leading commodities. Feed was the biggest item among farm supplies handled by cooperatives, the OSC specialist said. While the number of farm cooperatives in the country is declining—from 10,058 in the fiscal year 1953-54 down to 9,887 the following year—Mohn says membership remained stable at slightly more than 7 1/2 million.

Fatty Substances In Blood Studied By Oregon State

Investigation of links between certain fatty substances in the blood and the food we eat may provide western regional nutritionists some of the tools they need to improve physical well-being. Colleges in the 10 western states, including Oregon State college, are conducting a five-year study on the effects of diet and environment on certain fatty substances that sometimes collect on artery walls and restrict the flow of blood. Effects of vitamins, fats, age, altitude, climate and other factors on these fatty substances will be studied by project cooperators. At OSC, studies will concentrate on the roles that certain vitamins may play in the body's use of these fatty substances, known as cholesterol. In a part of the study already completed, four women were placed on identical diets for 30 days to learn how individual differences can cause day-to-day changes in the amount of cholesterol found in the blood. Ann Stimmlan, OSC foods and nutrition graduate, completed the study under direction of Betty Hawthorne, project leader. Results of OSC and regional studies will be pooled at the end of five years. Scientists want to learn why cholesterol from the diet is assimilated more by some people than others and what causes some persons to manufacture much more of it than others. Cholesterol is taken into the body in many foods, and is also easily manufactured in body tissues, according to Miss Hawthorne. Dr. Ansel Keys, a University of Minnesota scientist, has found in studies made in this country and in other areas of the world that diets high in fats cause more body cholesterol to accumulate. However, other evidence indicates that fat alone is not the only reason behind cholesterol manufacture.
