The product used was a loose salt containing 50 mg. of penicillin per ounce of sale plus a small amount of stabilizing agent. Field testing was limited to farms where bloating was a problem.

A total of 19 farms with about 1400 cows and 1600 steers and heifers were involved in the trial. Prior to starting the penicillin-salt mixtures a total of 70 cattle had died with bloating in the spring of 1956 on these farms, and a high per cent of the cattle were

bloating each day. After starting the penicillin-salt mixture there was a great reduction in the number of cases of bloating observed. On most farms no bloating was observed on the third day after starting the mixture, with only a few scattered cases being observed during the remainder of the bloating season. No cattle were lost from bloating after starting the penicillin-salt mixture. Average penicillin-salt consumption was about .7 ounce per animal per day. However, consumption varied from farm to farm reported was 1.37 ounces per animal per day. A trial using the penicillin-salt mixture was conducted at Montana State college, seven selected steers known to bloat readily were used in this test. These steers were grazing Ladine Clover and were checked six times each day, throughout the day for bloating. There was an average of 20 cases of bloating per day for these steers prior to feeding the penicillin-salt mixture. Penicillin-salt feeding was stopped and there was a rapid decrease in bloating. On the 5th and 6th day there was only one case. Penicillin-salt feeding was stopped and the number of cases increased. There were 17 cases of bloating the fourth day after the penicillin-salt feeding was stopped.

All other salt has to be removed when feeding the penicillin-salt mixture to insure maximum consumption of the mixture. Cattle can apparently detect the small amount of penicillin in the salt and will consume very

little of the mixture if plain salt is available. It was concluded that the penicillin-salt mixture was of definite value in reducing the incidence of bloating in cattle grazing legume pastures. There is only one catch to the program and that is the price of the penicillin-salt mixture is exceptionally high priced. It would probably not be economical as a preventive unless considerable trouble with bloating had been occurring. However, if you have a bunch of \$200 to \$300 cattle in good irrigated pasture and they start bloating this penicillin-salt mixture may be just the answer you need.
