The Junior clubs of 646 juniors have as their project aiding a crippled child at Eugene by furnishing foster home care expenses. There are 4600 women in Oregon, 99 senior clubs, 18 junior clubs. Their goal is to increase membership. There are five districts and the club members of General Federation are responsible for the Pure Food and Drug

Act, and Federal response to libraries.

Mrs. Johnson stresses the need for organizing new junior clubs. The 4th district has 16 clubs, one junior, the Tillicum club, with 643 district members. There were two scholarships awarded in the 4th district for the Penny Art fund.

Her closing thought was "Let's make good use of our time for our club, community, state and nation."
