State Farmers Said Holding Own in Price-Cost Squeeze

Oregon State College—Spending for U. S. farm and factory products, both inside and outside our borders, has never been greater and demands for most goods and services seem likely to stay strong throughout 1957, reports M. D. Thomas, Oregon State college agricultural economist. Meanwhile, farmers are just about holding their own in the price-cost squeeze as purchasing power of farm products hovers around the low levels of last year, Thomas points out. Although some soft spots are

showing in the state and nation's economy, they are balancing out elsewhere: increased investments in new plants and equipment, highways, and other construction are taking some of the sting out of the decline in home building. Weekly pay checks of factory workers are down slightly from a recent "high" but consumer spending has risen about 5 percent.

Government spending — state, local and federal—is also increasing. Foreign spending for U. S. products during the past year has risen sharply, partly with the help of our money, the economist explains. Value of farm exports has increased about 40 percent and non-farm exports about 20 percent. At the same time, agricultural imports are down about 7 percent while other imports are up at least 10 percent.

Increased costs of things farmers must buy have prevented their sharing fully in general economic trends. Some farmers have done better than last year while others lost ground. Showing slight price improvements at mid-year were wheat, wool, cattle, hogs and dairy products. On the downgrade were poultry, feed grains, hay, potatoes, seeds and some fruits and vegetables.
