

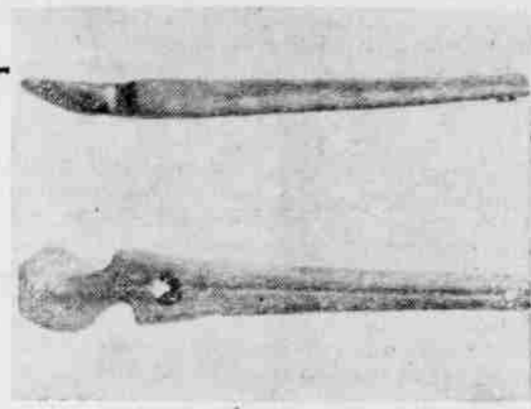
### Lexington School Announces Staff
