in the ear gained about one-half pound a day more on the average than untreated steers, according to David C. England, OSC animal husbandman. The OSC scientist conducted 10 feeding trials under widely different feeding conditions during the past year in cooperation with Oregon ranchers and county extension agents.

Locally-produced crops as the predominant feed source, supplemented for a balanced ration, included peavine silage in the Milton-Freewater area; potatoes in the Madras area; high grain rations at Condon; meadow hay and moderate grain levels in Wheeler county; and silage and hay with low grain levels in the Willamette valley.

England found that a 30 to 36 milligram implant appears to give maximum increase to most feeding situations, although large-framed dairy steers may respond better to 45 milligram implants.

Thirty milligrams of stilbestrol was a satisfactory level for weaner calves on a fattening ration containing either high or low levels of grain the OSC tests showed. The tests also demonstrated that spayed heifers gain faster when treated with stilbestrol implants, although a 15-milligram level appeared to be enough. The OSC animal scientist does not endorse heifer spaying. He said the tests demonstrated, however, that implants of stilbestrol—a female hormone—probably make up for some of the loss in normal hormone production that occurs when ovaries are removed.

Another finding was that a 30 milligram stilbestrol implant appears to produce as much or more growth increase than Synovex, a combination of two natural female hormones. Stilbestrol, a synthetic hormone, costs less than Synovex.

Farmers Urged To Weigh Soil Bank Benefits

Oregon farmers should take a careful second look at the Soil Bank program to make sure they're not missing a good bet, advises J. R. Beck, assistant director of the Oregon State college agricultural extension service.

Only a few of the state's farmers have put land in the Soil Bank to date, Beck reports. And with sign-up time for both the conservation reserve and the acreage reserve sections of the program just ahead, he thinks farmers should look both part of the program over with an eye to the future.

Present-day surpluses of many farm crops are holding down prices farmers receive, Beck explains. The Soil Bank is one way to take some of the poorer or hard-to-farm land out of crop production, helping reduce surplus stocks while giving farmers a fair income from their land.

Right now, the conservation reserve section of the program offers the best hope of any legislation in sight for farmers to reduce the price-depressing surpluses Beck believes. If the nations farmers would put 30 or more millions of acres under conservation reserve contracts, it is believed production and demand of farm products would be more nearly in balance, he says.

This means Oregon farmers should put a total of around 300,000 acres under the plan. Right now, only about 42,000 acres are under conservation reserve contracts.

Farmers with wheat allotments can also put land under the acreage reserve section of the Soil Bank. This helps cut surpluses of this farm product, Beck points out, and won't affect farmer's allotments in future years.

More information on the Soil Bank can be obtained from local county agricultural stabilization and conservation (ASC) offices. Farmers are urged to contact local ASC office soon, so they can plan the best Soil Bank contract for their farm.

New Plastic Sheeting Reduces Silage Loss In Horizontal Silos

Low cost, time and labor-saving horizontal silos may become even more popular among Oregon farmers now that plastic sheeting is available to protect silage against spoilage, says M. G. Huber, Oregon State college agricultural engineer.

U. S. department of agriculture studies have shown that either black polyethylene, vinyl, or neoprene-coated nylon will provide an airtight seal over the silage and greatly reduce surface spoilage, Huber reports.

bunker, or stack-type silos that permits greater spoilage has been a major disadvantage of such silos compared with the conventional upright types. Even so, the horizontal silos have grown in popularity, Huber says, because of low initial cost, ease of filling, and adaptability for mechanical feeding. Use of plastic covers in USDA experiments reduced silage losses in horizontal silos to the equivalent of surface spoilage in upright silos.

Hazards of air leaks through punctures in the plastic cover can be practically overcome by spreading a two three-inch layer of sawdust or other weighting material over the cover. Weight of the sawdust seals off the rest of the surface and confines spoilage to a small area when air enters through punctures or during the feeding operation.

Polyethylene or vinyl plastic sheeting is less durable but also less expensive than neoprene-supported nylon. Huber says both vinyl and poly covers are satisfactory and have a life-expectancy of one to three years depending largely upon the care received. Neoprene-coated nylon was not easily damaged by punctures or weighting materials in three years of USDA testing and will give five to 10 years of service, the specialist reports.

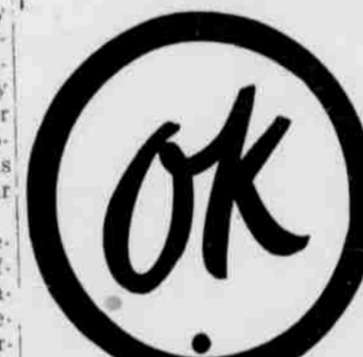
