Evaluate Power Sites The Federal Power Commission has been asked officially by the state of Oregon to hold up final determination of Pacific Northwest Power Company's application to build Pleasant Valley and Mountain Sheep dams on the Snake River until Jan. 31, to allow the State Resources Board to investigate the merits of the projects, Governor Holmes announced Wednesday.

Action was taken in a motion from Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton which includes 50 pages of exceptions to the FPC examiners' recommendation of last July for approval of construction licenses for the dams.

Thornton pointed out that last month Governor Holmes asked the State Hydroelectric Commission to refer to the Water Resources Board the application of PNPC

The club, one of the largest livestock clubs in the county, is led by Mrs. Bernard Doherty and Mrs. Eugene Wardwell. Each of the 11 members enrolled have turned in a project completion cards which entitles the club to a 100% completion certificate. They made out a program of work for the full club year which entitled them to a certificate for this. These certificates along with individual point and completion card will be presented to leaders and members at the 4-H achievement party which will be held on November 2.

Counties Eye Solons A representative of county government will attend all sessions of the Oregon Legislature if a decision made by 26 members of the sixth district of the Oregon Association of County Officials is adopted by a majority of members of the state districts at the state convention in Portland November 21 and 22.

Plans for the National association of County Officials convention in Portland next August, were discussed and will be extended at early meetings, said Judge F. L. Phipps, veteran executive secretary of the state association.

State Labor Adequate The shortage of technical workers in the State Highway Department that began five years ago reached its peak this year and is now about on the level, reports Charles Terry, state director of civil service.

The nationwide highway construction program approved by the federal government required an increase of technical employees in Oregon's highway department which had been met. The shortage of stenographers and typists continues in some state departments. The labor situation in the state institutions is not serious.

Military Seminar Quote International law experts addressing the recent West Coast Law Seminar at Treasure Island think Girard, the U. S. soldier who killed a Japanese woman while on guard duty will get a better break in the courts of Japan than if he were tried in a U. S. military court of justice, reports Jason Lee, Salem attorney who with 80 other Naval Reserve officers, practicing attorneys, attended the two-week seminar.

Herman Oliver Resigns After having served 23 years on the State Board of Higher Education, Herman Oliver sent his resignation to Governor Holmes last week.

In accepting the resignation the governor thanked the John Day rancher for his long years of service to the state. In addition to service on the education board from which he resigned, Oliver had served one term on the State Highway Commission.
